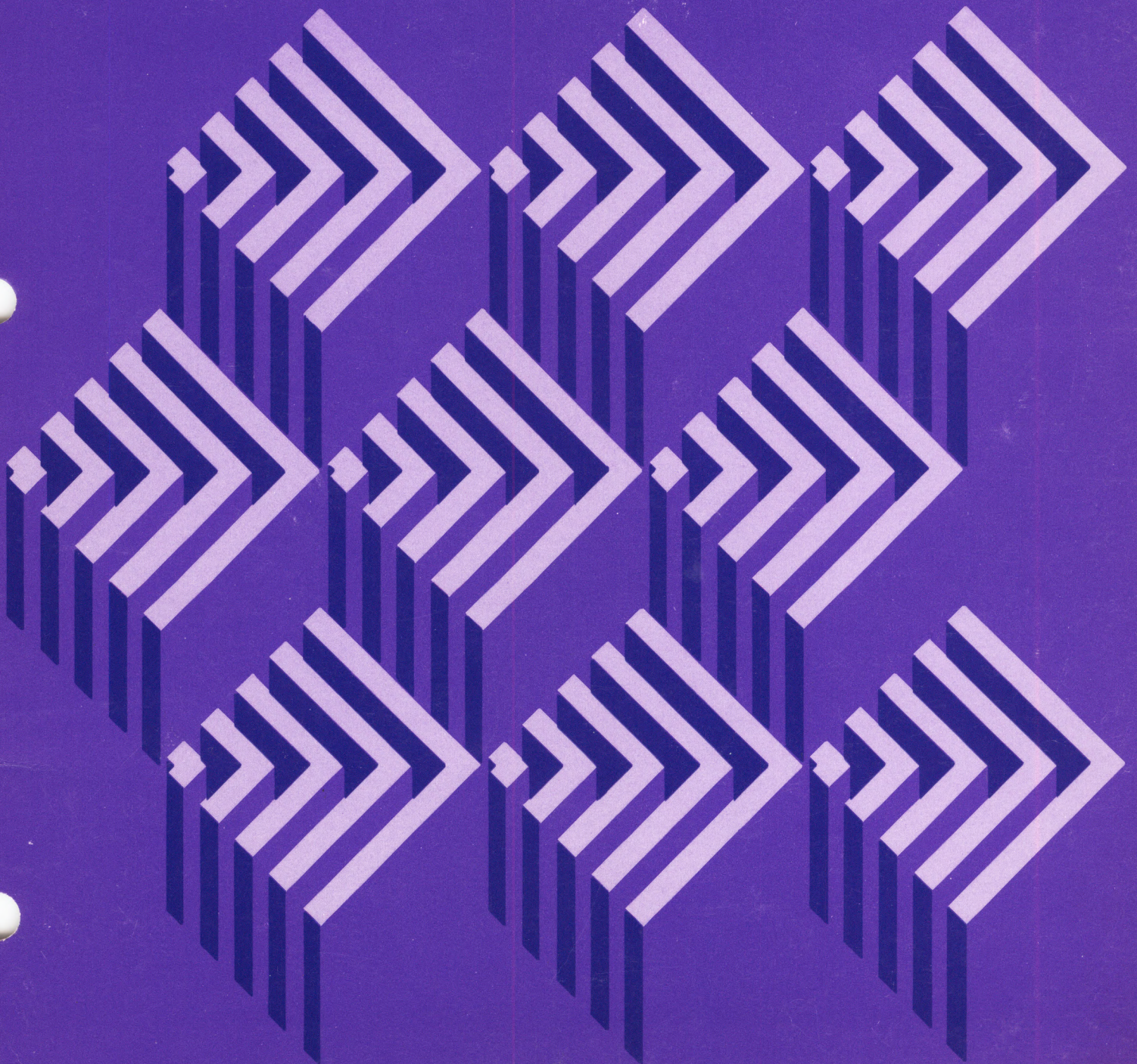

This edition applies to all printer models of the IBM Displaywriter System, and to all subsequent releases and modifications until otherwise indicated in new editions or Technical Newsletters. Changes are made periodically to the information herein.

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CHAPTER 1. FEATURES OF THE IBM 5215 PRINTER

The IBM 5215 Printer is the part of the IBM Displaywriter System with which you produce printed output. After creating documents at the work station and storing them on diskette, you can at any time print them at the printer.

This book describes only the physical features of the printer. The steps you follow to print a document are listed in "Topic 4. Printing" in the IBM Displaywriter System Operator Training Book 1 -- Basic Topics.

EXTERNAL PRINTER FEATURES

In order to maintain the printer and change features when necessary, you must be familiar with the printer features. The following two pages contain an illustration of the IBM 5215 Printer and descriptions of its features. The features you will need to be familiar with are numbered in the illustration, and each numbered item is explained on the facing page.

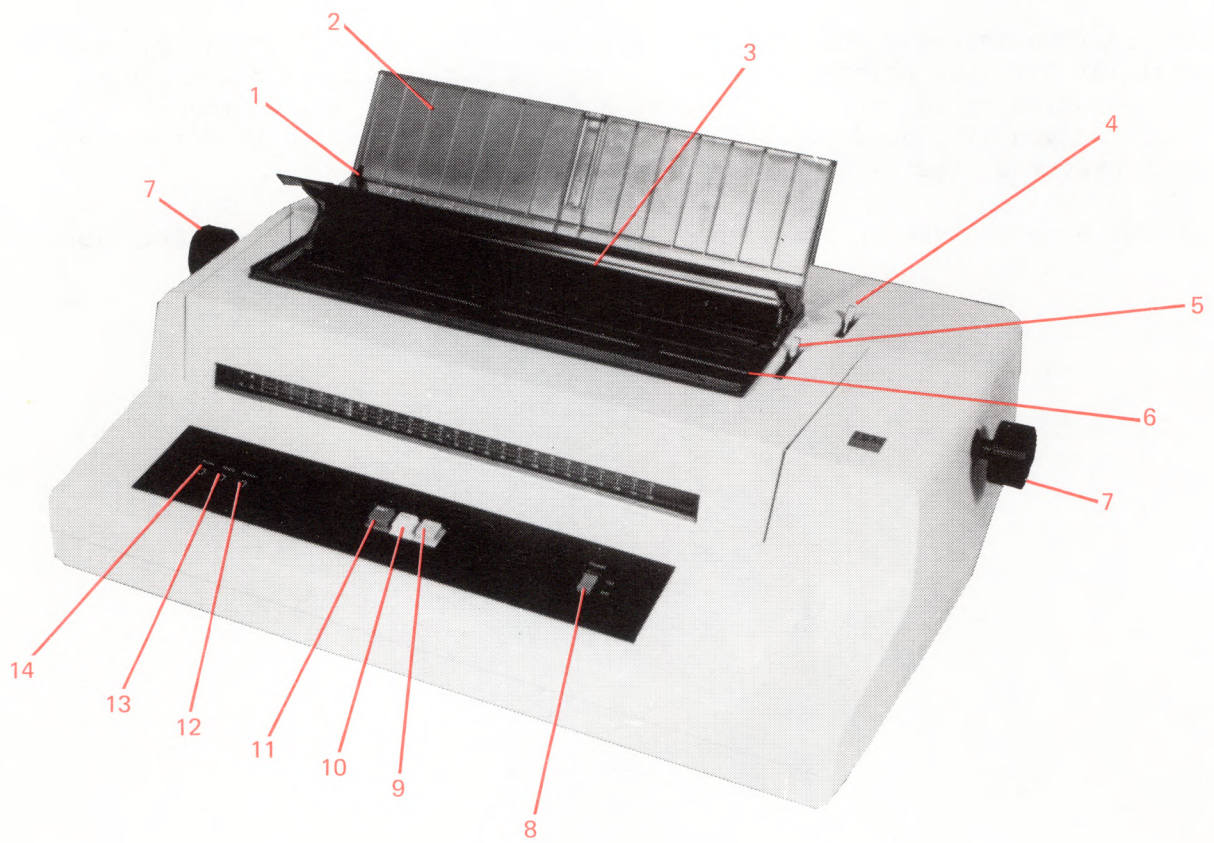
Locate each feature on the printer illustration and read its description.

PREFACE

This manual describes the IBM 5215 Printer, the IBM 5218 Printwheel Printer, and the IBM 5228 Printwheel Printer for the IBM Displaywriter System. It points out the features on the printers and explains such tasks as changing the paper, ribbons, platens, and printwheels and how to respond to printer lights and use the paper handling devices.

AUDIENCE

This publication is intended for the IBM Displaywriter System operators who use the IBM 5215 Printer, the IBM 5218 Printerwheel Printer, or the IBM 5228 Printwheel Printer. No prior knowledge or experience is required.



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1. Paper Guide	Aligns the left edge of the paper into the printer. The paper guide slides across the paper centering scale. When aligned with the bold vertical line on the paper centering scale, the left edge of the paper corresponds to zero (0) on the margin scale.
2. Paper Support	Gives vertical support for cut sheet paper in the printer.
3. Sound Shield	Reduces sound and protects the platen and ribbon area.
4. Paper Release Lever	Releases tension from the platen for easy paper insertion and removal.
5. Paper Bail Lever	Pulls the paper bail forward for inserting paper.
6. Paper Bail	Holds the paper tightly against the platen. The paper bail automatically goes back against the paper when printing begins.
7. Platen Knobs	Assist in rolling paper in and out of the printer. When the left knob is pressed in, it will give the platen a free roll in either direction.
8. On/Off Switch	Supplies power to the printer. Press to the "On" position to turn on and to the "Off" position to turn off.
9. Cancel Button (Blue)	Signals the work station to cancel the job in print.
10. Stop Button (Yellow)	Signals the printer to stop printing. To resume printing, press "Start."
11. Start Button (Green)	Begins the printing process. Press to start printing.
12. Ribbon Light (Yellow)	Goes on when the ribbon needs replacing. The printer completes the line in print, carrier returns, and stops in the center of the page. Change Printer Ribbon prompts at the work station. After changing the ribbon, press "Start" to continue printing.
13. Ready Light (Green)	Goes on when the printer is ready to begin printing. The light goes out when the ribbon light flashes on.
14. Power Light (Red)	Goes on when the power to the printer is turned on.

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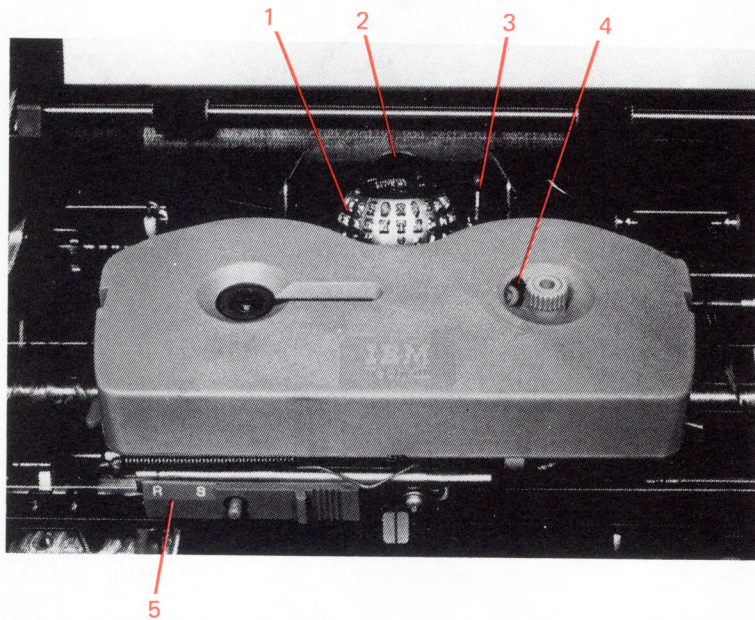
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ELEMENT AND RIBBON CARTRIDGE

Lift the printer cover to locate the features shown in the illustration below.



1. **Element** -- Contains the characters used to print a document.
2. **Cardholder** -- Secures small cards and short sheets of paper tightly against the platen.
3. **Impression Control** -- Adjusts the striking force of the element. Set the control on "3" for routine jobs. Move to a higher number for stencils and multiple copies.
4. **Ribbon Cartridge** -- contains the printer ribbon.
5. **Ribbon/Stencil Control** -- Adjusts the ribbon for printing stencils. Set the control on "S" for printing stencils. Slide the lever to "R" for normal printing.

OPTIONAL FEATURES

Optional features for the IBM 5215 Printer are described in Chapter 3. These optional features are needed only if continuous forms are used.

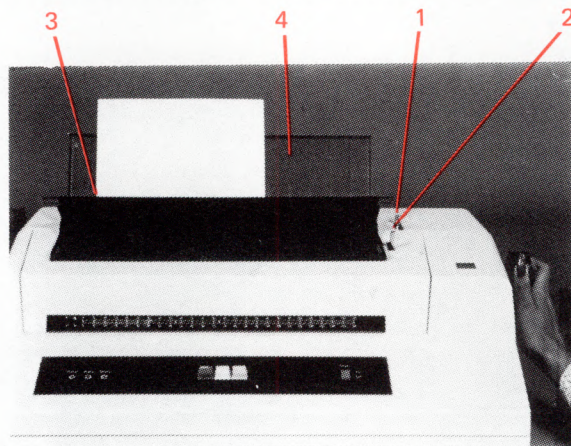
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CHAPTER 2. CHANGING FEATURES

You will sometimes need to perform several mechanical tasks as you use the printer. You will need to change paper, change the ribbon, and change the element. These tasks are described in this chapter.

TO INSERT PAPER

The system tells you when to insert paper in the printer when the Load Paper in Printer message shows on the display. To insert paper in the printer, use the illustration below and the steps that follow it.



- Pull the paper bail (2) away from the platen.
- Align the left edge of the paper guide (3) with the bold vertical line on the paper support (4).
- Place the paper into the printer until it is behind the cardholder and the top edge is aligned with the bottom red line on the cardholder.
- Press Start. The system indexes the paper up, the paper bail closes, and printing begins.

TO REMOVE PAPER

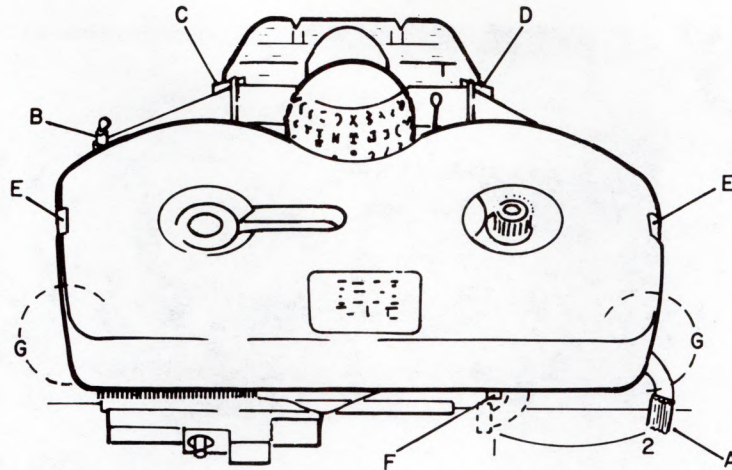
To remove paper from the printer, follow these steps:

- Pull the paper release lever (1) forward.
- Pull the paper out.

Under normal circumstances, as each page completes printing, the system automatically indexes the paper to the end of the page.

CHANGING THE RIBBON

When the Change Printer ribbon message shows on the display, the yellow ribbon light goes on at the printer. Use the following illustration as a guide to remove or install a ribbon.



To Remove a Ribbon

To remove a ribbon, follow these steps:

- Open the cover.
- Pull the ribbon load lever (A) to the left until it clicks against the stop (F).
- With both hands, hold the ribbon cartridge at the front corners (G), and lift straight up.
- Unthread the ribbon from the ribbon guides (C and D).

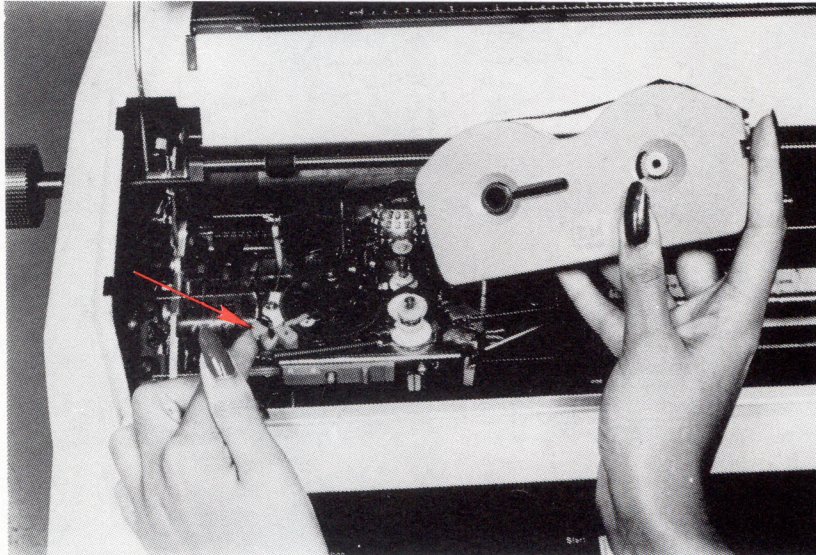
To Install a New Ribbon

To install a new ribbon, follow these steps:

- Pull the load lever (A) to the left until it clicks against the stop (F).
- Put the leader portion of the ribbon over the outside of the guidepost (B) and the ribbon guides (C and D).
- Place the ribbon cartridge so it fits between the spring clips (E).
- Push both ends of the cartridge down firmly.
- Thread the leader portion of the ribbon through the ribbon guides (C and D).
- Turn the knob on the cartridge in the direction of the arrow until the leader is past the ribbon guide (C).

- Move the ribbon load lever (A) to the far right until it clicks.
- Close the cover. The ribbon light will go off.

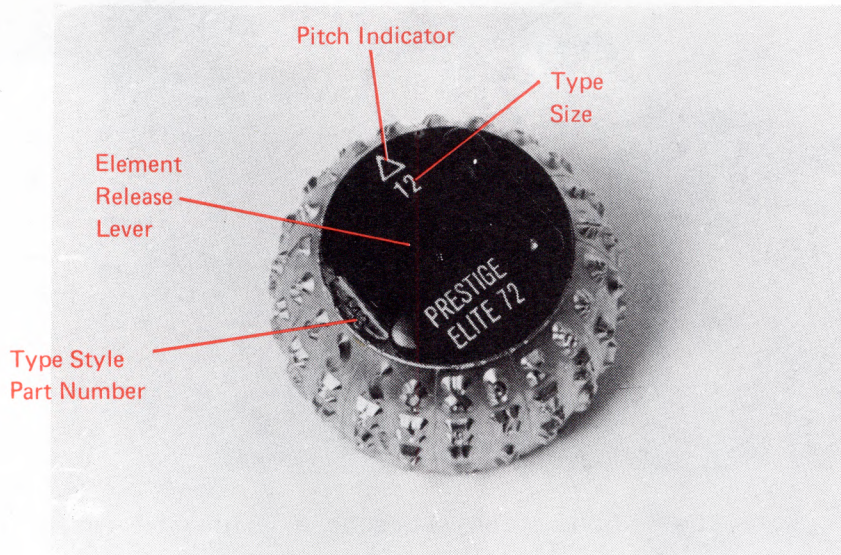
To Install a Used Ribbon



To install a used ribbon, raise the end-of-ribbon lever (see arrow in the illustration above) and hold it up while putting the ribbon cartridge in place. Then follow the steps for installing a new ribbon.

ELEMENT DESCRIPTION

Look at the illustration below and read the description of the parts of an element which follow.



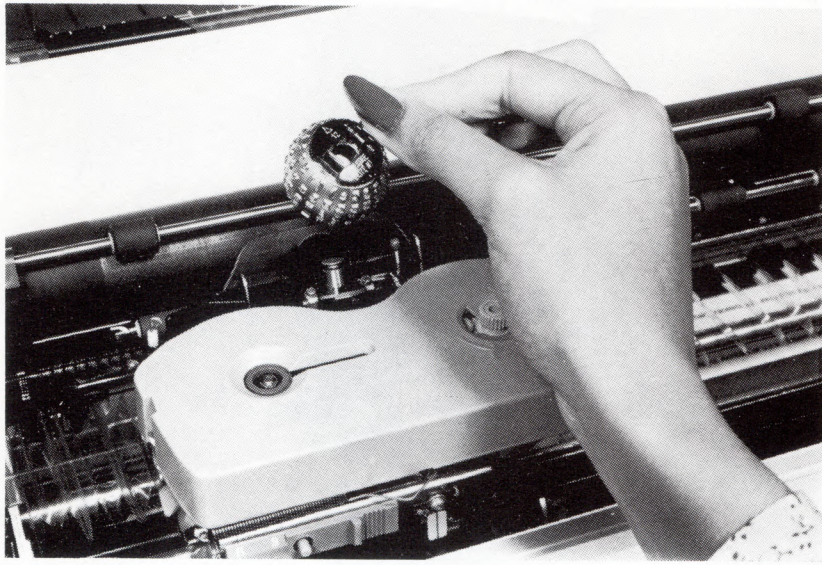
- **Pitch Indicator and Type Size**

△ = 12 pitch (12 character per inch)

▲ = 10 pitch (10 characters per inch)

- **Element Release Lever** -- Used to insert and remove the element.
- **Type Style Name** -- The name assigned to a particular type face.
- **Type Style Part Number** -- The number assigned to each available type style.

To Remove an Element



To remove an element, use the illustration above as a guide and follow these steps:

- Lift the element release lever to the open position. When it is open, you will hear a click.
- Hold the lever, and lift the element straight off the post.

To Put On an Element

To put on an element, follow these steps:

- Lift the element lever to the open position.
- Place the element on the post with the triangle pointing toward the platen.
- Rotate the element until it fits into a groove and will not rotate.
- Once the element is in place, close the lever.

CHAPTER 3. OPTIONAL FEATURES

If continuous-form paper or continuous-form envelopes are used with the IBM 5215 Printer, a Pin-Feed Platen is installed to handle the continuous forms.

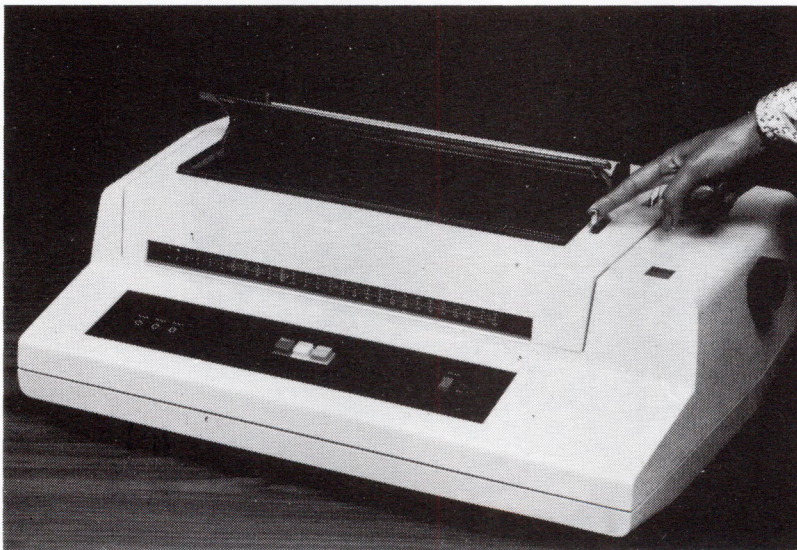
PIN-FEED PLATEN

If roll paper is used a Roll Paper Holder is installed. The Roll Paper Holder holds paper on to the printer. Installation of the Pin-Fed Platen and Roll Paper Holder are described in this chapter.

Before installing the Pin-Feed Platen, the platen used for regular printing must be removed from the printer.

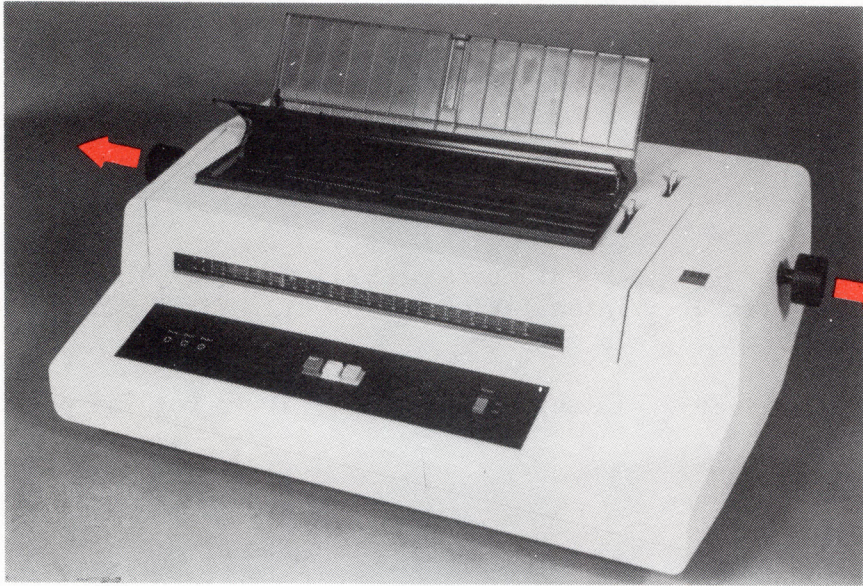
To Remove the Platen and

Install the Pin-Feed Platen

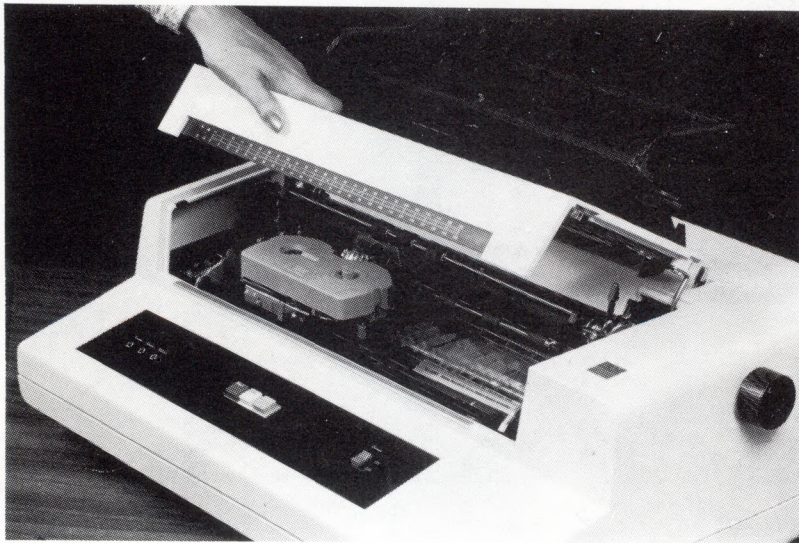


Turn the printer power off.

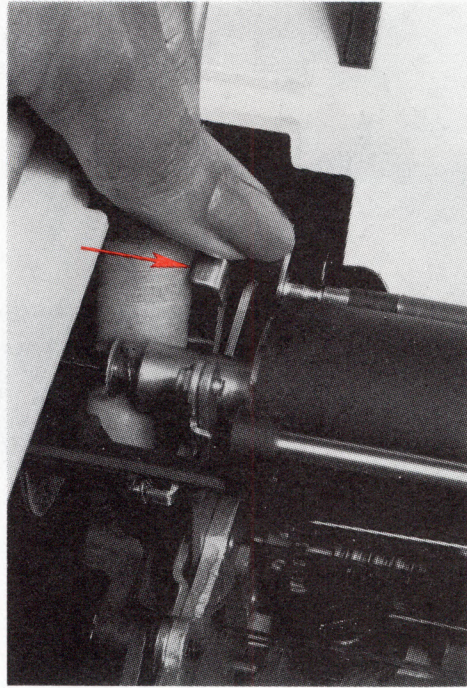
Pull the paper bail forward.



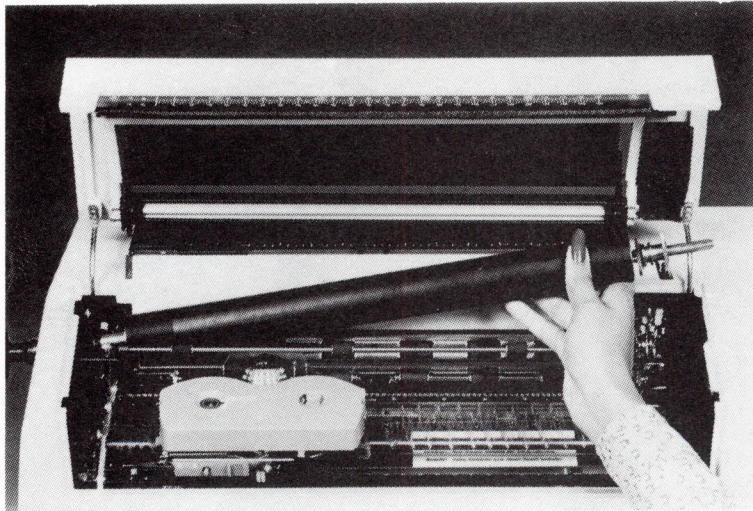
Pull the left and right platen knobs away from the printer.



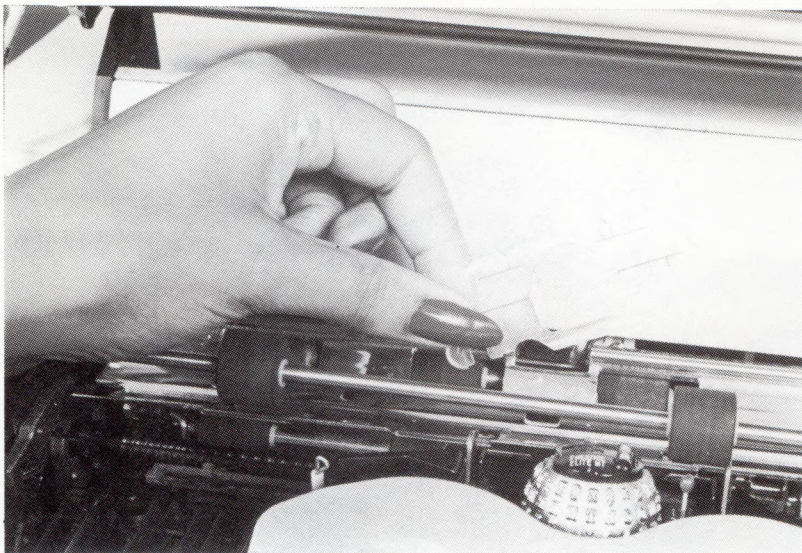
Raise the printer cover.



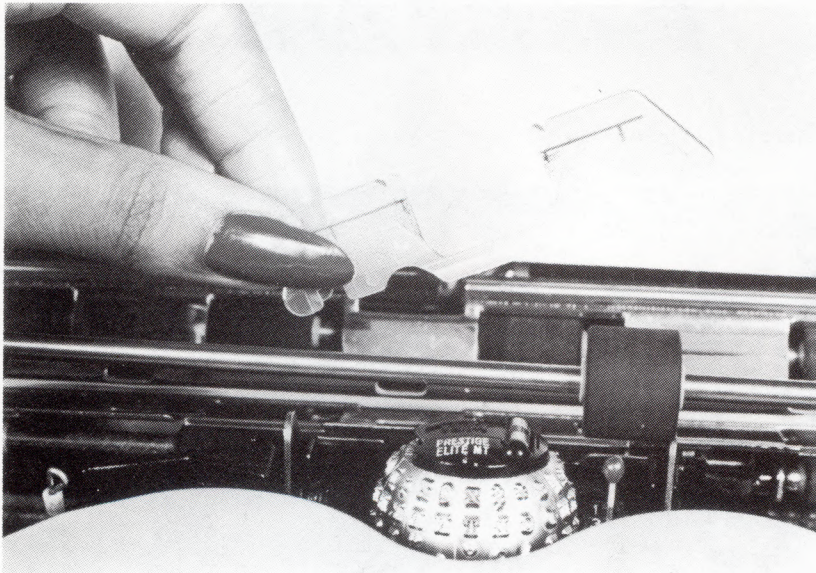
Press the two platen release levers down.



Lift the platen out of the printer.

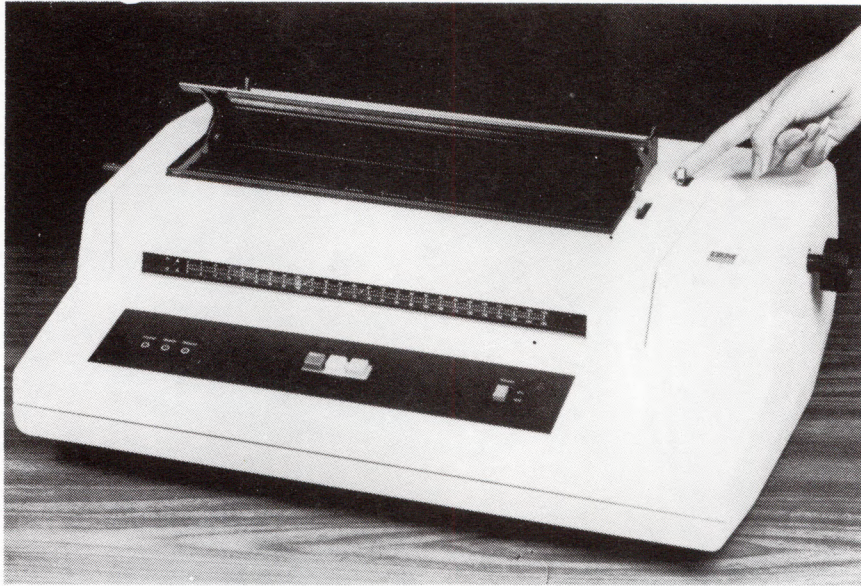


Remove the cardholder with the enclosed top that is used for normal printing.

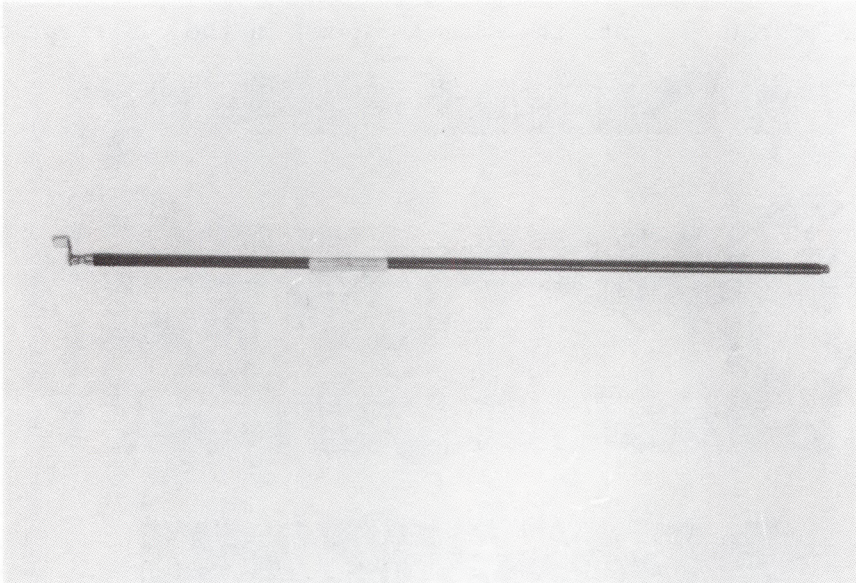


Snap the pin-feed cardholder onto the printer. Make sure the smooth side of the cardholder is against the platen.

Close the printer cover.

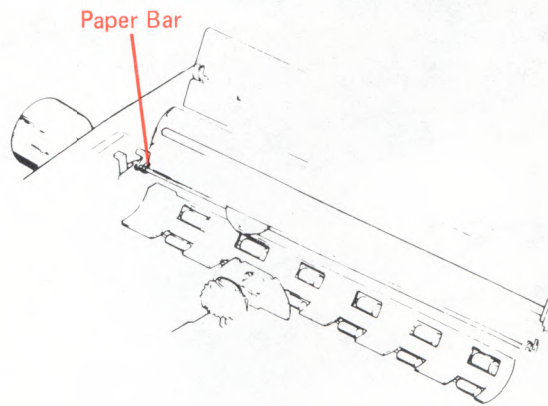


Pull the paper release lever forward.



Open the printer cover.

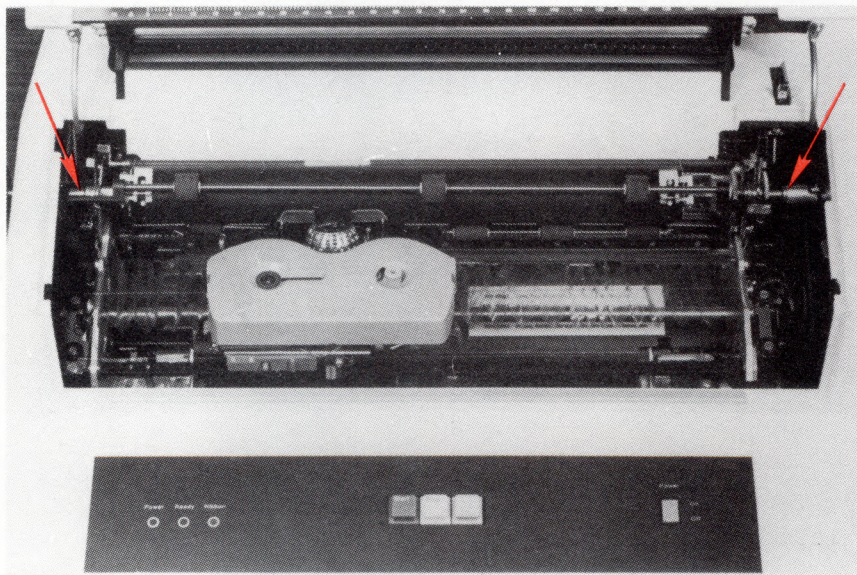
Locate the Paper Bar, as shown in the above photograph. The Paper Bar will be used when inserting continuous paper into the printer (see page 26).



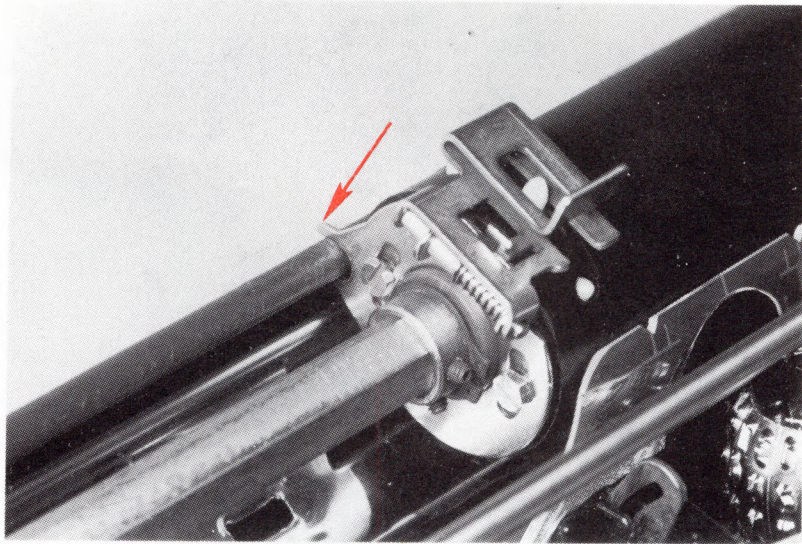
Insert the Paper Bar into the printer so that the handle is on the left.

Slide the right (square) end of the Paper Bar into the right slot.

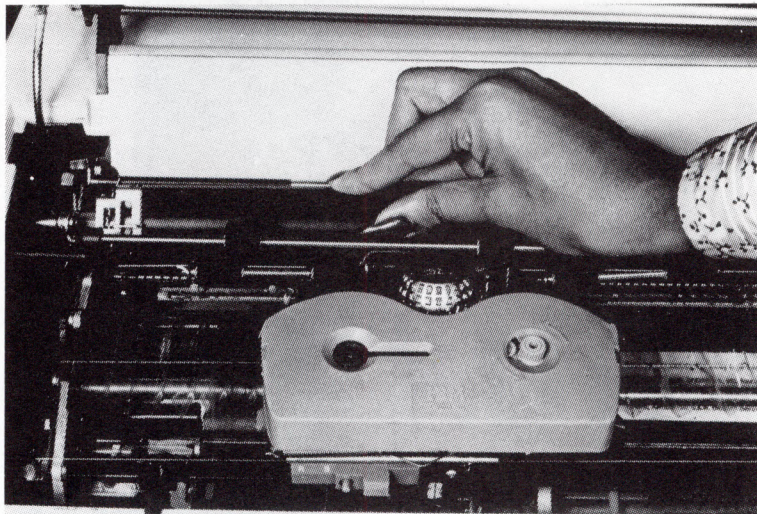
Connect the left end of the bar into the slot as shown in the illustration above.



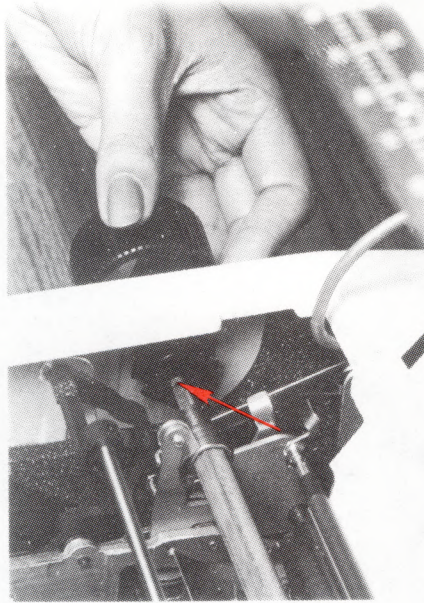
Lay the Pin-Feed Platen into the silver platen holder. Make sure the square end of the platen is on the left and the round end is on the right.



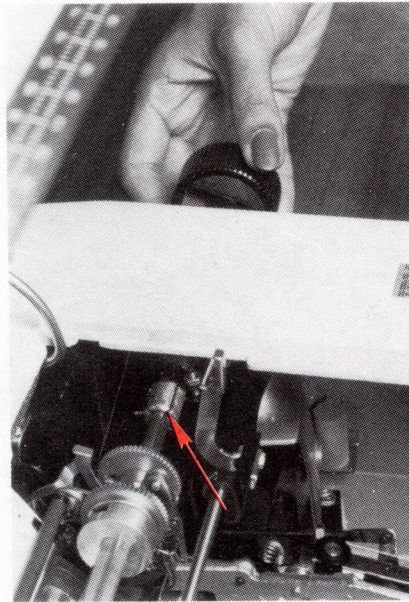
Locate forks on each end of the platen and connect them to the Paper Bar as shown in the photograph.



Press down on the platen to snap it into place.



Close the left platen knob by aligning the square hole with the square end of the platen; press the knob in.



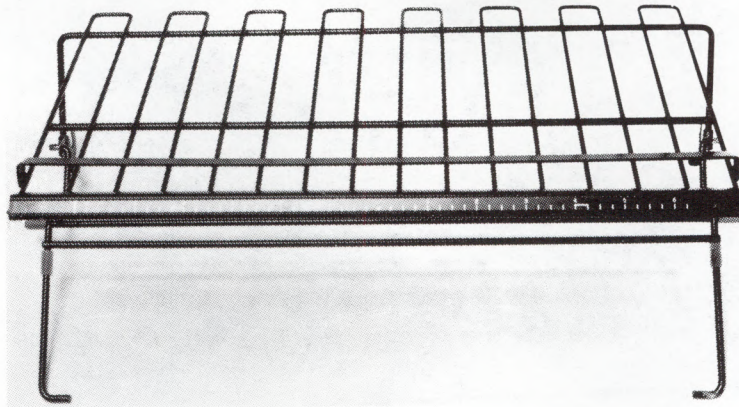
Align the right end of the platen knob with the round hole in the knob; press to close.

Close the paper bail.

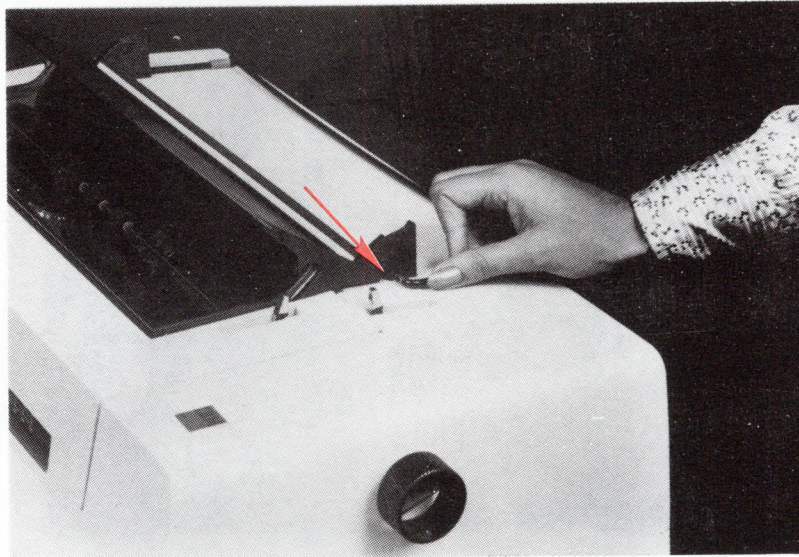
Close the printer cover.

To Attach the Paper Separator

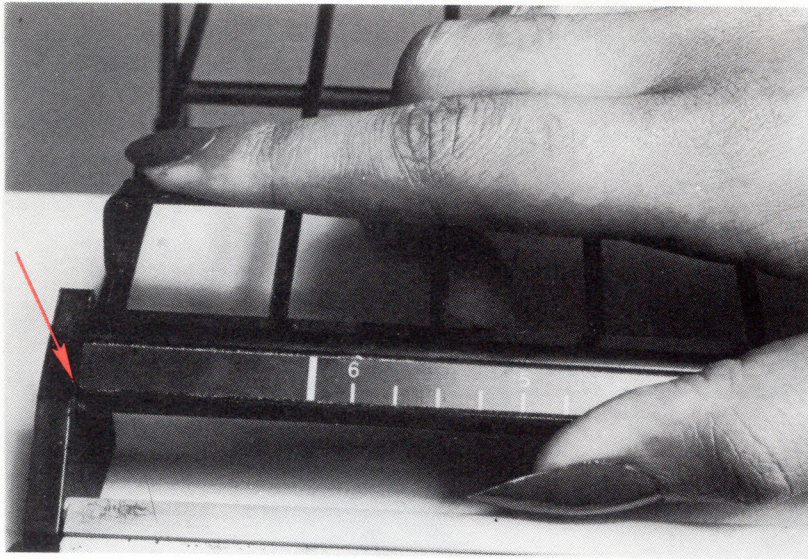
After installing the Pin-Feed Platen, the Paper Separator must be attached to the printer.



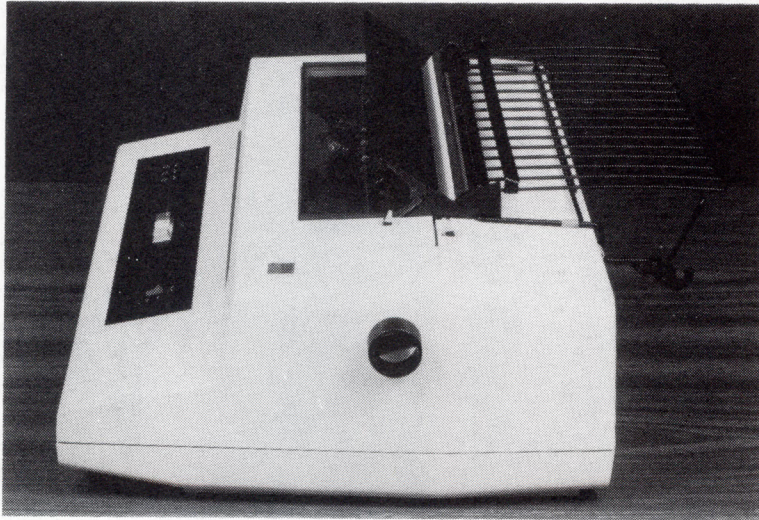
Locate the Paper Separator and place on the printer.



Insert the wire brackets into the mounting holes on each side of the printer.

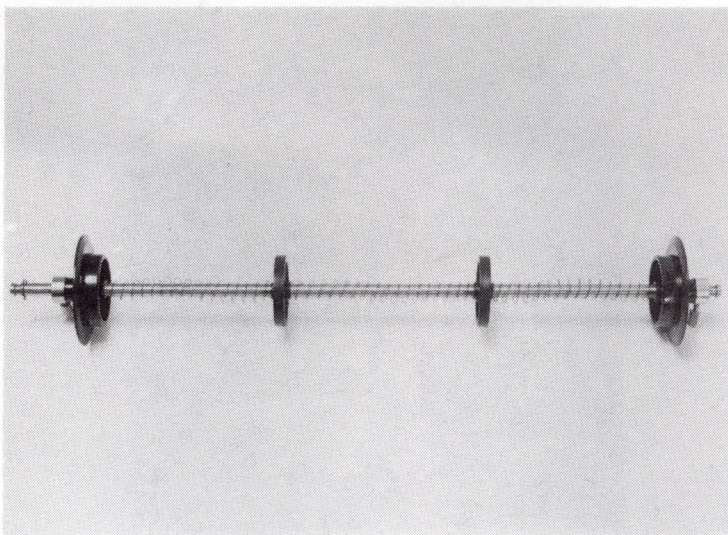


Insert the front brackets into the notches on each side of the printer.

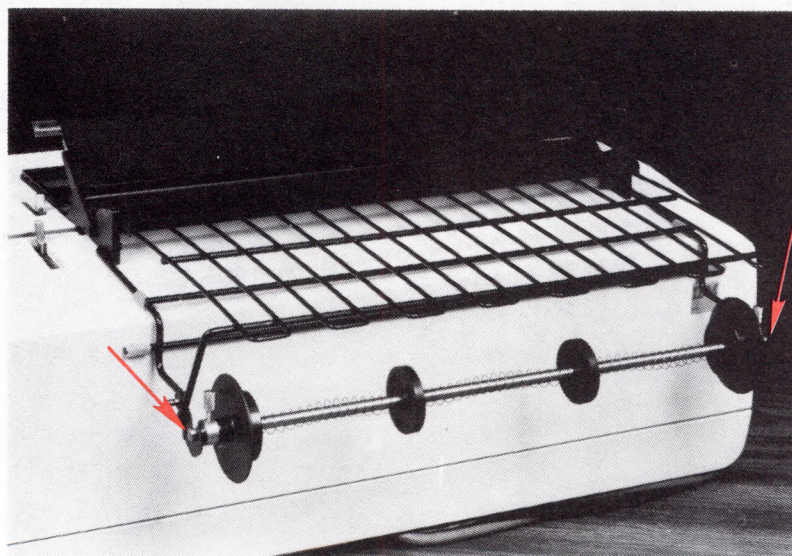


When the Paper Separator is installed, it should look like the photograph above.

To Attach the Paper Guide Rollers

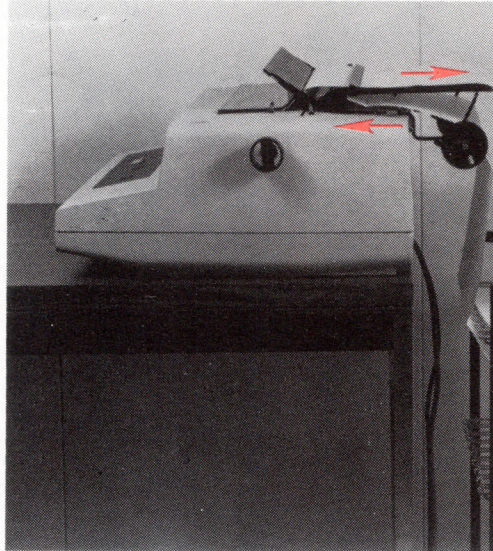


Locate the paper guide rollers, as shown in the above photograph.

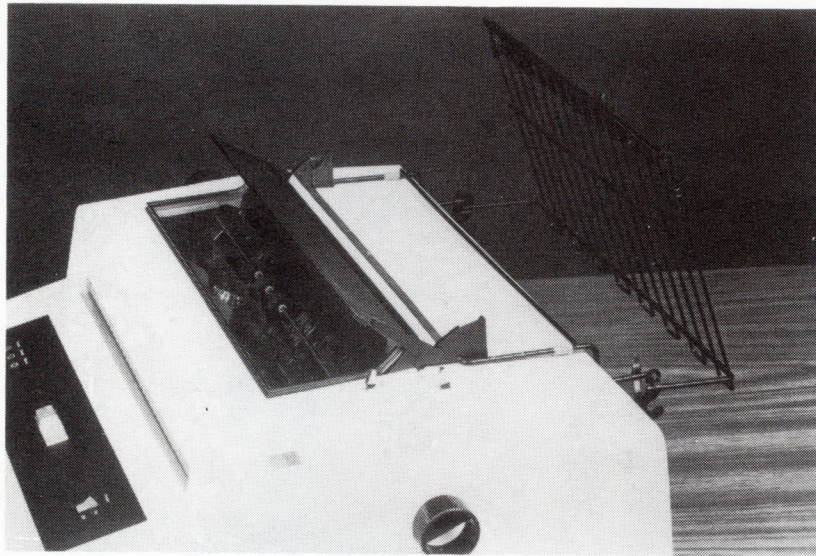


Connect the paper guide rollers into the hooks on the back of the Paper Separator.

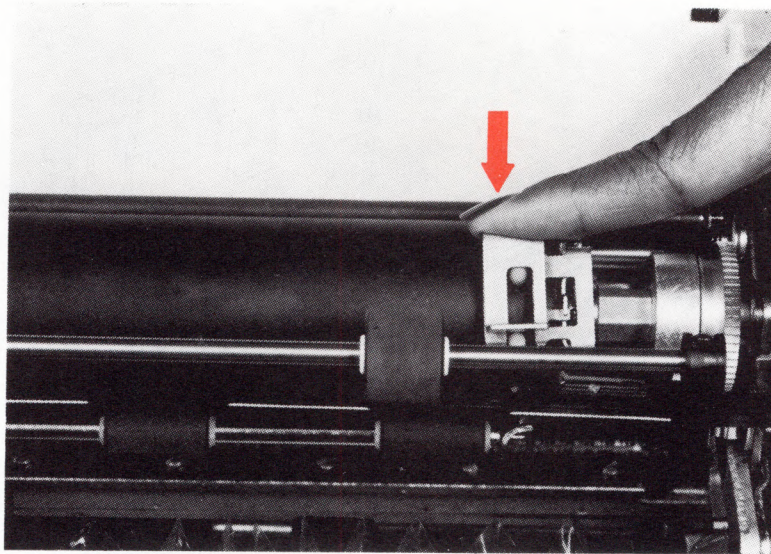
TO INSERT CONTINUOUS PAPER INTO THE PIN-FEED PLATEN



The paper path for continuous-form paper in the Pin-Feed Platen should follow the arrows in the above photograph.

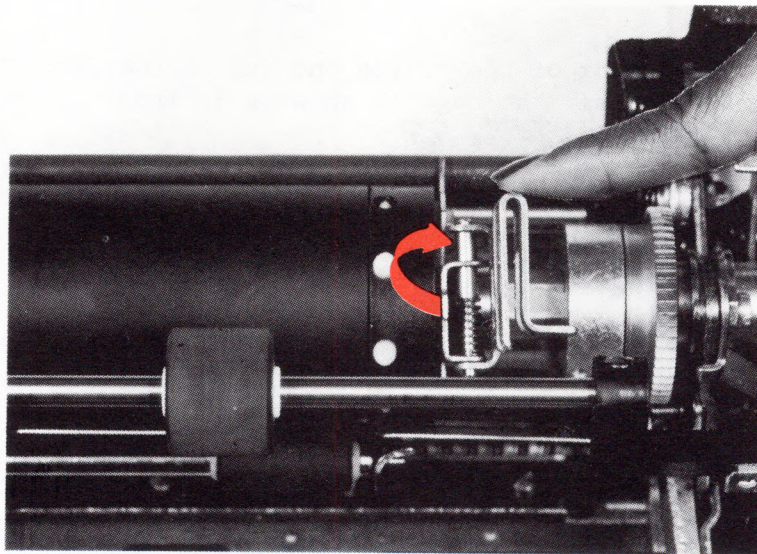


Lift the Paper Separator Gate.

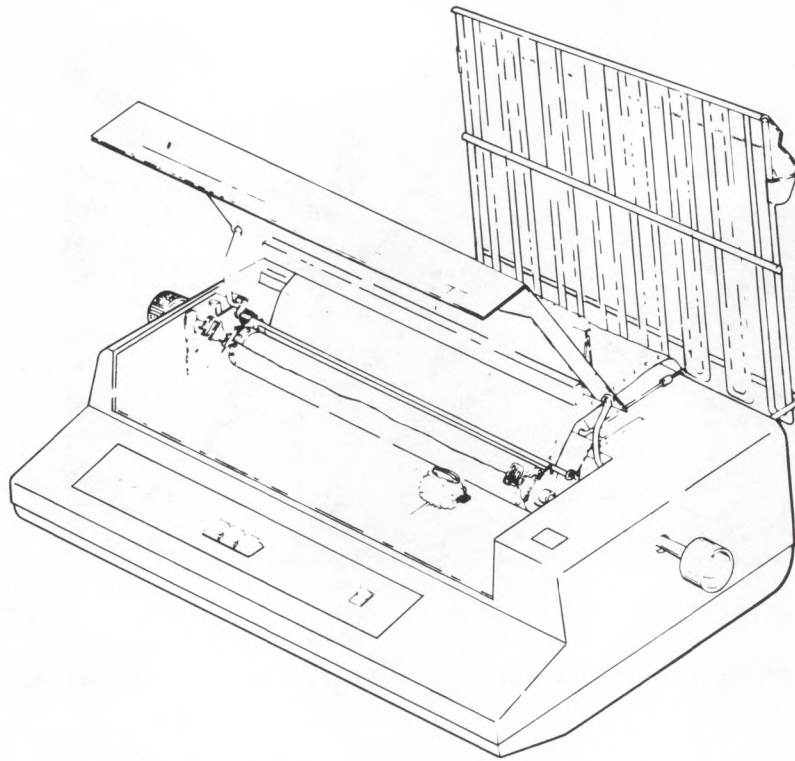


Open the printer cover

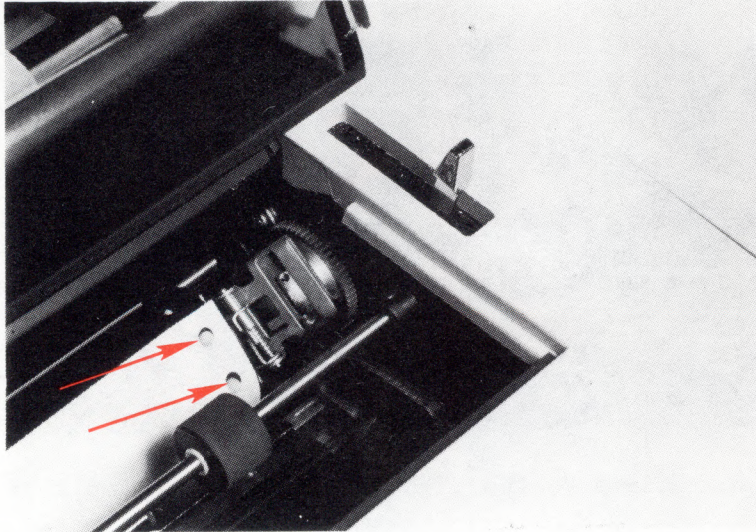
Push down on the paper clamps on each side of the platen to release the clamps for opening.



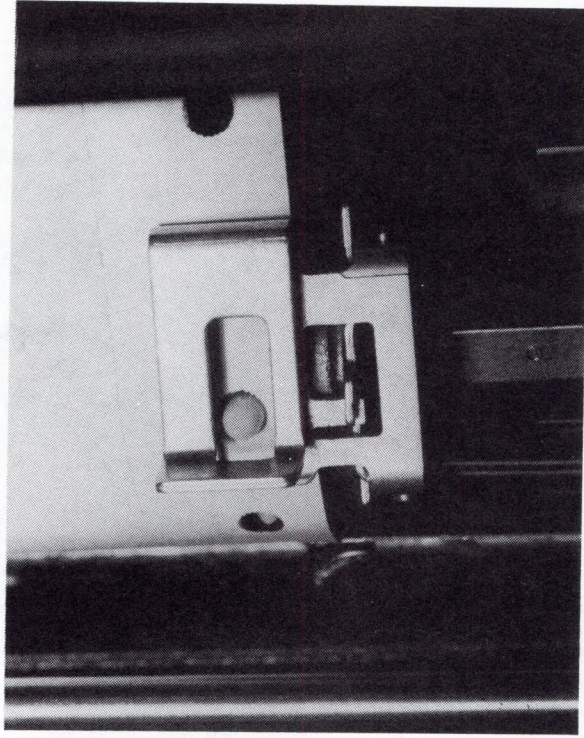
Open the right paper clamp to the right and the left clamp to the left.



Insert the paper into the back of the platen and behind the Paper Bar (see page 17). Push the paper down until the edge is showing in front of the platen.

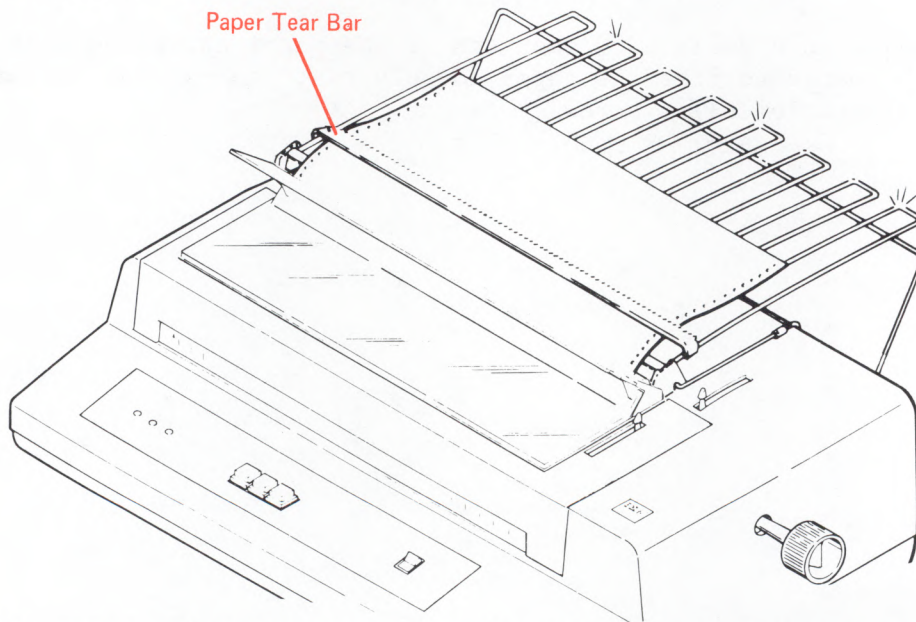


Pull the paper up to have enough to align the holes in the paper with the white pins on the platen.

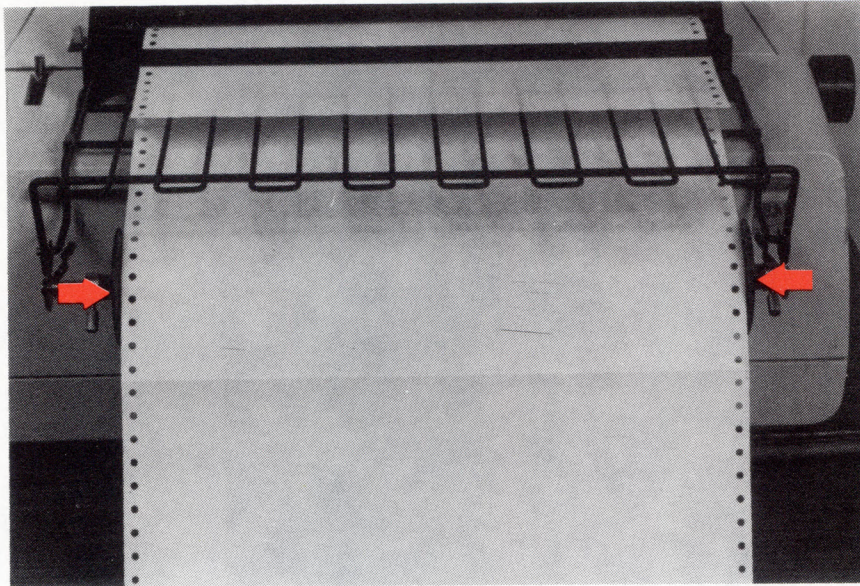


Close the paper clamps to secure the paper.

Close the paper bail. Close the printer cover.



Guide the paper under the paper tear bar so that it rests on the Paper Separator Gate in the closed position.



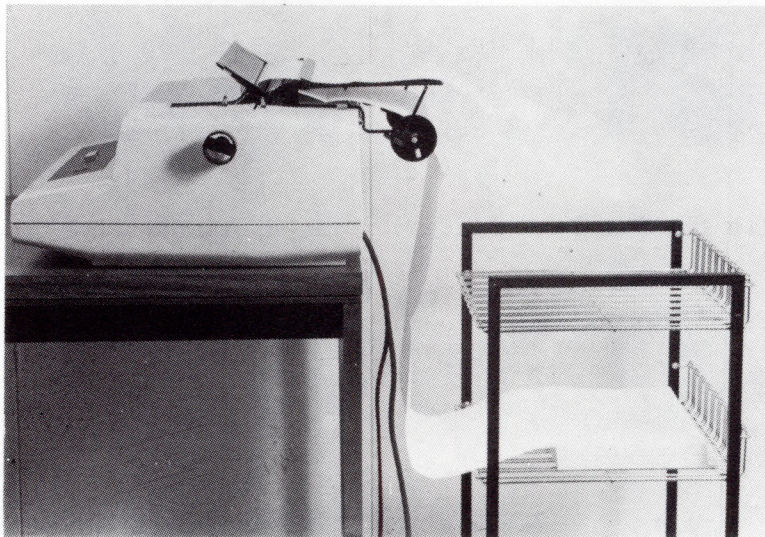
The photograph above shows the printer with paper guide rollers from the back.

- Adjust the paper guide rollers in the back of the printer to accommodate the width of continuous paper used in the printer.
- Unscrew the adjustable collars on each end of the paper and slide them to the side of the paper so that the paper loosely rest against the collars. Tighten the adjustable collar screws.

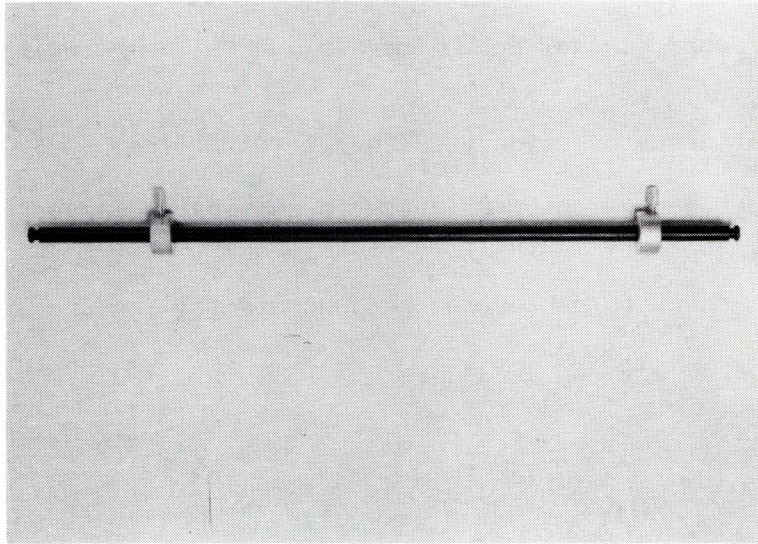
TO POSITION THE PAPER STACKER

As the paper falls from the Paper Separator, it should stack neatly into the top level of the paper stacker as shown in the illustration below.

- Position the paper stacker approximately 100 mm (4 inches) from the back of the printer.
- Place the continuous paper on the lower level of the paper stacker.
- After a few pages have printed, check to see that the paper is fan-folding neatly into place on the top level of the paper stacker.
- Periodically, check to make sure the paper is falling evenly into the stacker.

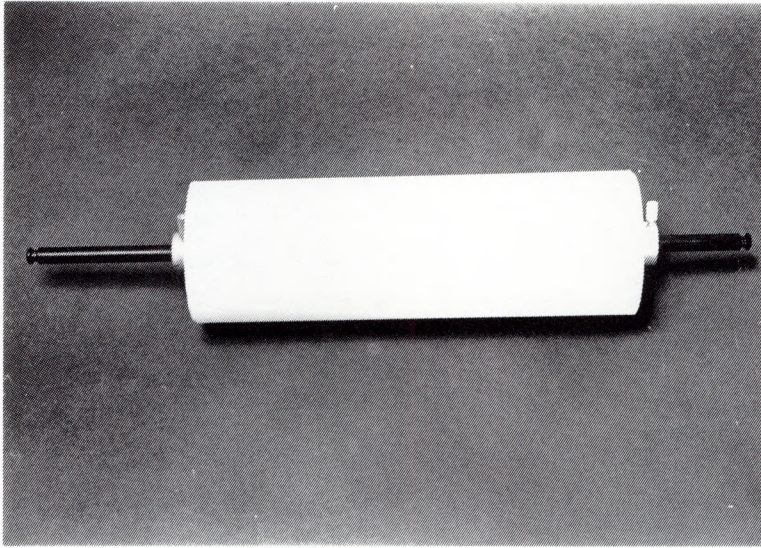


The Roll Paper Holder



To use roll paper with the Pin-Feed Platen, roll paper must be attached to the holder.

Locate the roll paper holder as shown in the photograph above.



To install paper on the the roll paper holder:

- Remove one of the collar screws (donut-like clamps) from the paper holder.
- Insert the roll paper bar into the core of the roll paper.
- Re-install the collar screw.
- Insert the roll paper bar on the hooks on each side of the paper holder.

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CHAPTER 4. MAINTAINING THE PRINTER

CLEANING THE PRINTER COVER

Use a soft brush to dust the carrier assembly.

Use only a mild liquid detergent to clean the plastic parts of the printer; certain cleaning fluids may be harmful. If stains persist, call your service representative.

CLEANING THE CARDHOLDER AND MARGIN SCALE

Use only a mild liquid detergent and damp cloth to clean the cardholder and margin scale.

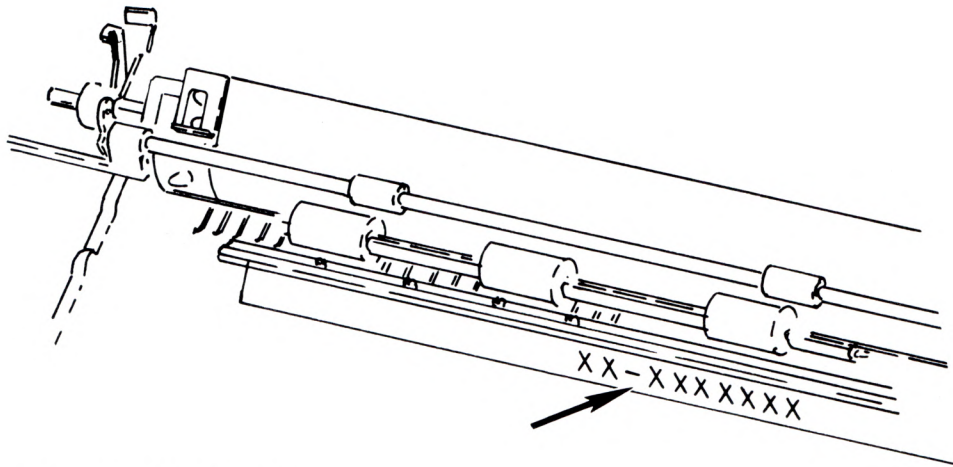
CLEANING THE ELEMENT

Elements should be cleaned by using a dry brush. Clean the element by brushing up and away from you.

SERIAL NUMBER

You will need the printer serial number to identify your printer for service calls, inventories, or your own personal records.

To locate the serial number:



- Raise the printer cover.
- Move the carrier all the way to the left by hand.
- Locate the serial number directly below the platen to the left of the metal bar.

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CHAPTER 5. FEATURES OF THE IBM 5218 AND IBM 5228 PRINTWHEEL PRINTER

The IBM 5218 or IBM 5228 Printwheel Printer is a key part of your IBM Displaywriter System. With it, you will be able to print documents you create at your work station.

Both the IBM 5218 and IBM 5228 Printwheel Printers are bi-directional impact printers that use several different 96-character printwheel cartridges. Printwheel cartridges are color-coded and available in 10 pitch (10 characters/inch), 12 pitch (12 characters/inch), 15 pitch (15 characters/inch) and PSM (proportional spacing). The maximum printing line for the IBM 5218 printer is 335.28 mm (13.2 inches). The maximum printing line for the IBM 5228 Printer is 432 mm (17.0 inches).

The IBM 5218 and IBM 5228 Printwheel Printers are available in the following models:

- 5218-A01 which has a rated burst print speed of up to 40 characters per second in 10 pitch.
- 5218-A02 which has a rated burst print speed of up to 60 characters per second in 10 pitch.
- 5218-A03 which has a rated burst print speed of up to 40 characters per second in 10 pitch.
- 5218-A04 which has a rated burst print speed of up to 60 characters per second in 10 pitch.
- 5228-A12 which has a rated burst speed of up to 60 characters per second in 10 pitch.

Unless otherwise stated, all features and operations described in this guide apply to all printer model numbers.

HOW TO USE THIS SECTION OF THE PRINTER GUIDE

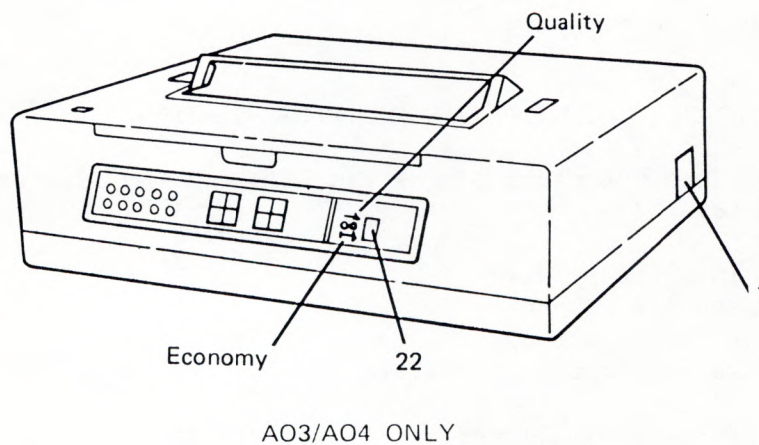
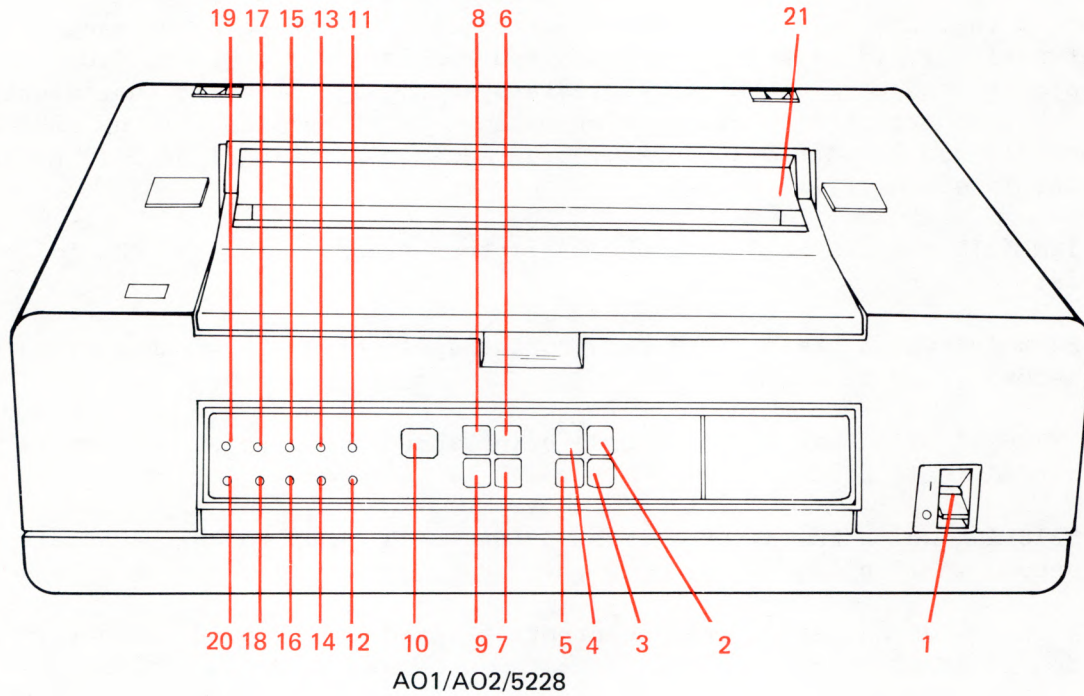
This section describes the parts of the IBM 5218 and IBM 5228 Printwheel Printers and how to:



- Insert paper into the printer
- Remove and install a ribbon
- Change a printwheel cartridge
- Install and use each optional feature

The term IBM 5218/IBM 5228 will refer to either printer throughout this manual. Each optional feature is discussed in separate chapters. Refer to the chapter heading that pertains to the type of feature you need to learn about.

When you begin to print, certain prompts and messages will appear on the display. To learn more about what they mean, refer to the "Prompts and Messages" section of the Operator Reference Guide or the Prompts and Messages Guide.

If you have more than one work station attached to a printer, refer to "Sharing a Printer" in Topic 4 of the Operator Training Book 1 -- Basic Topics or the "Printer Sharing Procedures" Chapter of the Work Station Procedures Guide.



1. Power Switch
Supplies power to the printer. Press the switch to the (I) for ON and to the (O) for OFF. When the printer is turned on, it performs a diagnostic check for about 15 seconds. DO NOT open the printer cover during the check. When the check is completed, the printwheel moves to the center of the platen. If the printer is turned OFF wait ten seconds before turning ON.
2.  (Paper Advance)
Used to advance paper in the printer. When pressed, the paper will advance 0.5 mm (1/48 in.). Continued depression will advance the paper 3.7 mm (7/48 in.). If held down continuously, the paper advances in 4.2 mm (1/6 inch) increments.
3.  (Paper Return)
Used to move paper backwards in the printer. When pressed, the paper will return 0.5 mm (1/48 in.). Continued depression will return the paper an additional 3.7 mm (7/48 inches) increments. If held down continuously, the paper returns in 4.2 mm (1/6 in.) increments.
4. Load
When paper is inserted in the printer and Load is pressed, the paper will advance to the top of the cardholder, (for details see "Chapter 9.")
5. Release
Used to release the feed rollers and the paper bail for paper adjustments or paper removal. The first depression opens the feed rollers and the paper bail, the second depression closes the feed rollers and the paper is held in place. This button works only if the Ready light is off.
6. Print Test
When pressed, all the characters on the printwheel should print like the sample below. This test, which varies for each type style, enables you to check the print quality and verify that the printer will print.

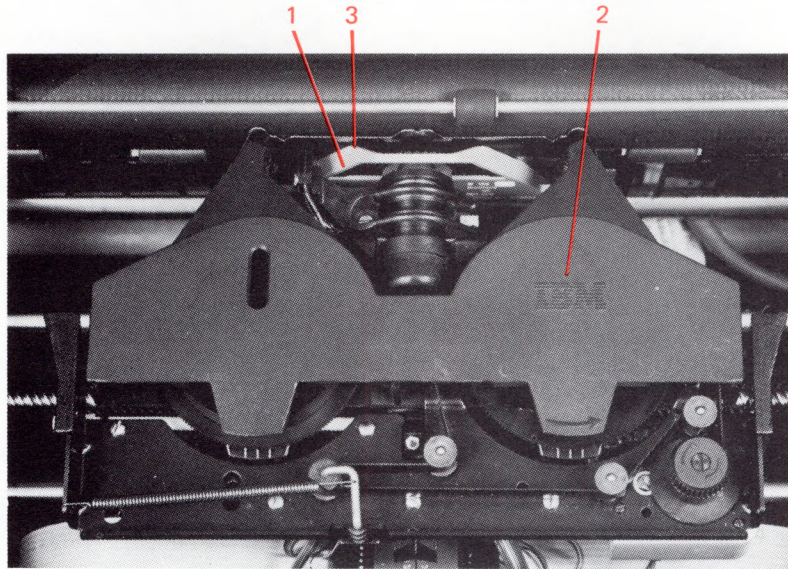

Note: The statistic log prints after the print test on the A03 and A04 models.

| 7. Cancel | Used to cancel the present job and allow the next job to begin printing. |
| 8. Start | Press to begin printing. |
| 9. Stop | When pressed, printing stops. Press Start to resume printing. |
| 10. Two-digit Display | Used during problem determination and indicates printer error conditions and printer exceptions. |
| 11. Change Font Light | Not used. |
| 12. Diag Mode | Used by service personnel only. |
| 13. Setup Light | Indicates that paper in the printer must be removed. If the IBM Tractor Feed is installed, vertical alignment of the next form is required. |
| 14. Load Paper Light | Not used. |
| 15. Printer Exception Light | Indicates that a printer error has occurred. The error will be identified by a message or prompt on the display and explained in the <u>IBM Displaywriter System 5218/5228 Printwheel Printer Problem Determination Guide</u> . |
| 16. Release Light | Indicates the paper bail and the feed rollers have been opened to adjust or remove paper manually. |
| 17. Ribbon Light | Indicates that the ribbon needs changing. The message Change Printer Ribbon will also show on the display. The light will remain on until a new ribbon cartridge is installed. |
| 18. Ready Light | Indicates that the printer is ready to print. |
| 19. Power On Light | Indicates that the printer has been turned on. |
| 20. On Line Light | Indicates that the printer is ready to print documents from the IBM Displaywriter System. |
| 21. Sound Shield | Reduces printing sound and protects ribbon area. |
| 22. Ribbon Saver Switch | Used to select an increase ribbon yield. When the switch is set to quality, ribbon life will be approximately 1 million characters per ribbon cartridge. When the switch is set to economy, ribbon life will be approximately 3 million characters per ribbon cartridge with a decrease in print quality. |

CHAPTER 6. PRINTWHEEL AND RIBBON CARTRIDGE

Lift the printer cover to locate the features shown in the photograph below.



1. **Printwheel Cartridge** -- contains the printwheel needed to print a document.
2. **Ribbon Cartridge** -- contains the printer ribbon.
3. **Cardholder** -- secures paper, small cards, and short sheets of paper against the platen and shows where characters will print. It also serves as a reference point for lining up the paper.

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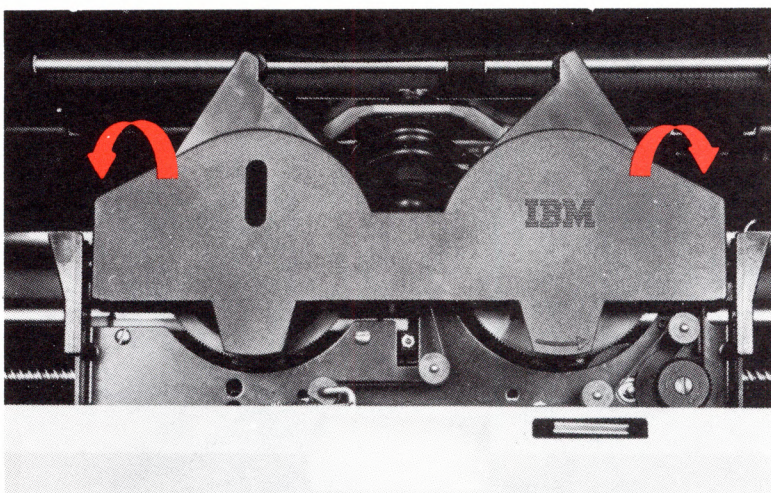
CHAPTER 7. CHANGING THE RIBBON

When the change Printer Ribbon message shows on the display, the ribbon light will turn on. Use the following steps as a guide to complete removing and installing a printer ribbon.

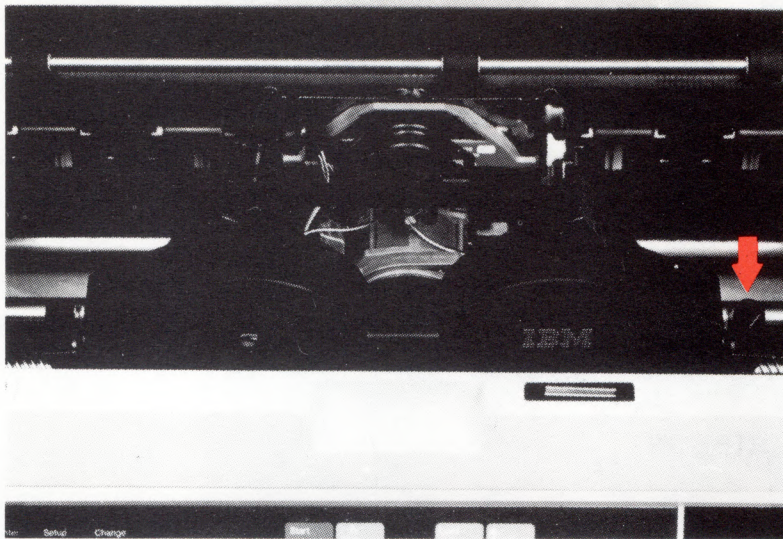
TO REMOVE A RIBBON

Turn the printer power on.

Open the printer cover.



Tilt the ribbon cartridge toward the front of the printer. A small amount of ribbon may remain on the cartridge.

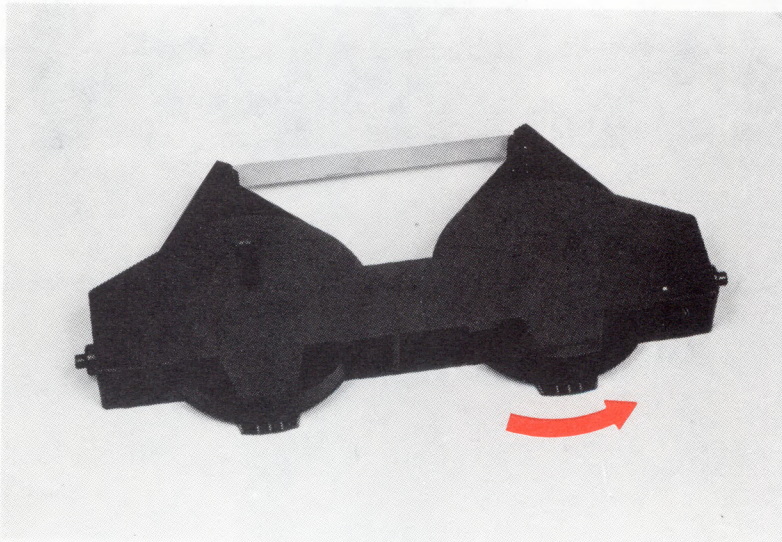


Press down on the tab to the right of the ribbon mechanism to release the ribbon cartridge.

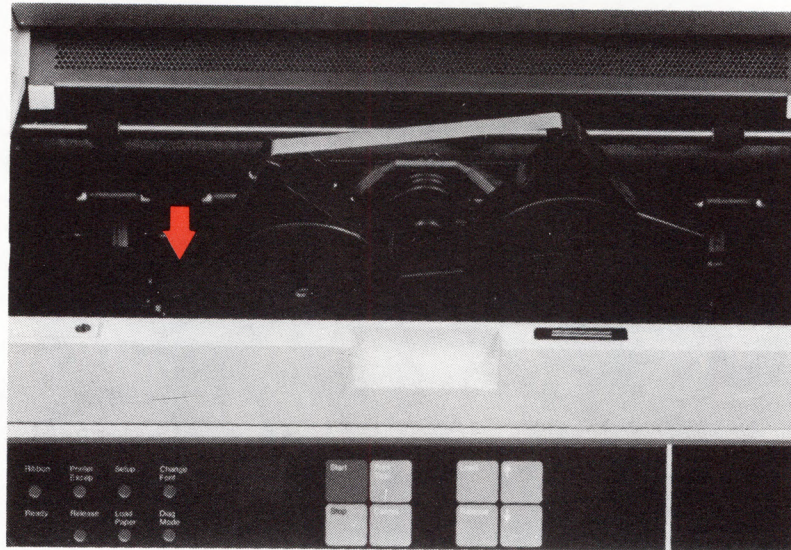
Lift the cartridge out.

TO INSTALL A NEW RIBBON

To install a new ribbon, follow these steps:



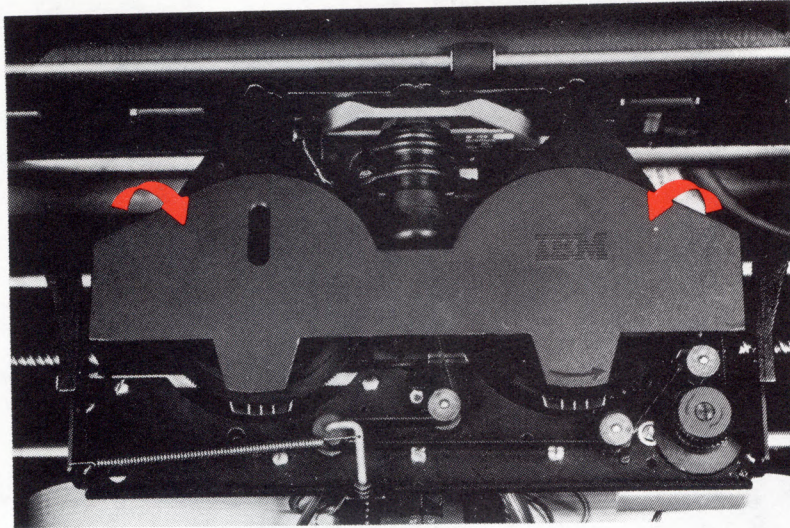
Turn the right spool to remove any slack in the ribbon.



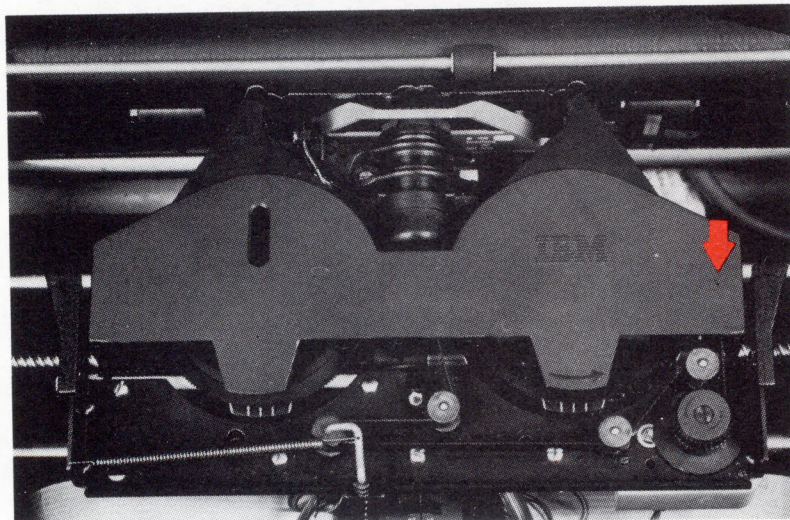
Insert the left edge of the ribbon cartridge into the left slot.



Insert the right edge of the ribbon cartridge into the right slot.
Press down until the cartridge clicks into place.



Lay the ribbon cartridge down to the print position.



Turn the ribbon advance knob clockwise past the leader portion of the ribbon.

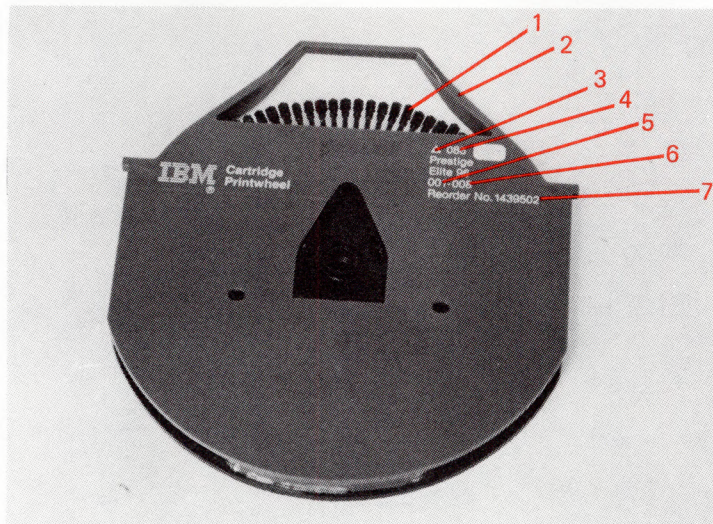
Close the printer cover and press Start. If the Ready light does not go on, refer to the IBM Displaywriter System 5218/5228 Printwheel Printer Problem Determination Guide.

CHAPTER 8. CHANGING THE PRINTWHEEL

The Printwheel contains the characters needed to print a document on the IBM 5218/IBM 5228 Printwheel Printer. In this chapter you learn how to install and remove a printwheel.

PRINTWHEEL DESCRIPTIONS

Look at the photograph below and read the description of the parts of the printwheel cartridge that follow:



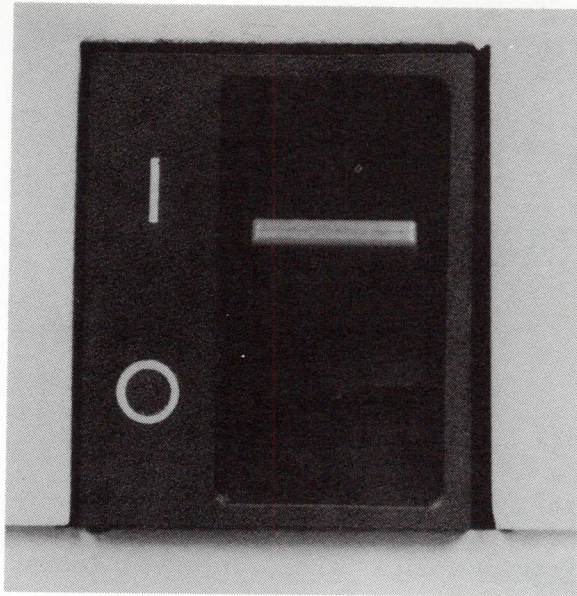
1. **Printwheel** -- contains the characters needed to print a document.
2. **Printwheel Cartridge** -- Holds the printwheel.
3. **Pitch Indicator** -- Shows how many characters per inch a document will print.

- = 15 Pitch (15 characters/inch) -- Blue
- △ = 12 Pitch (12 characters/inch) -- Green
- ▲ = 10 Pitch (10 characters/inch) -- Red
- = Proportional Spacing -- Orange

4. **Type Style Name** -- Identifies the number which corresponds to the type style being used.
5. **Type Style Name** -- The name assigned to a particular type style.
6. **Keyboard ID Number** -- Indicates range of keyboards supported by the printwheel used.
7. **Re-order Number** -- Used for ordering additional printwheels.

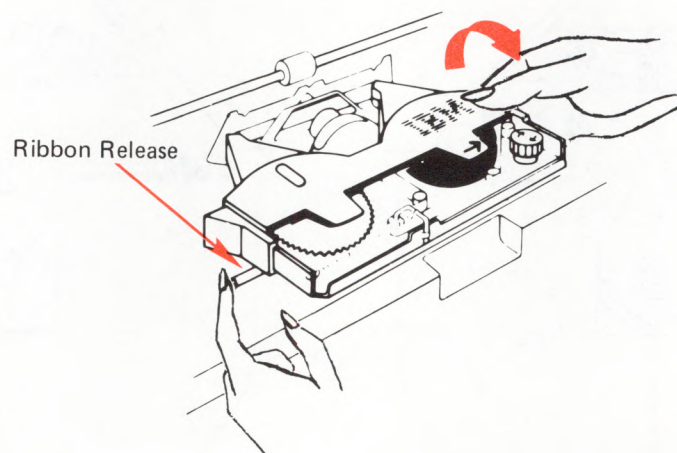
TO REMOVE A PRINTWHEEL CARTRIDGE

To remove a printwheel cartridge, use the illustration and the steps that follow:

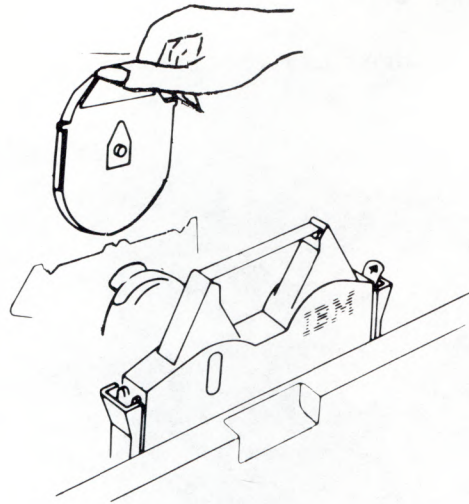


Make sure the printer power is on.

Open the printer cover.

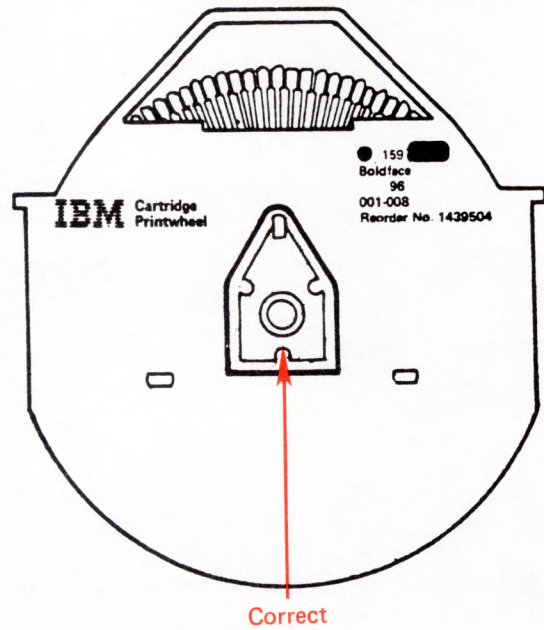
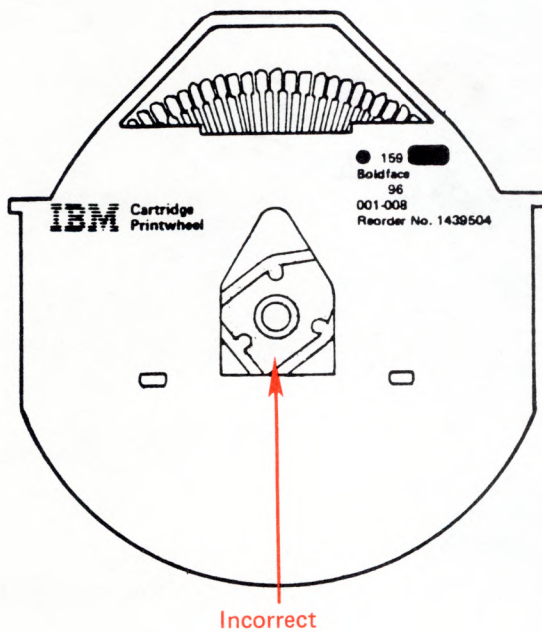


Press and hold the ribbon release located to the left of the ribbon cartridge while tilting the ribbon mechanism. Do not remove the ribbon.

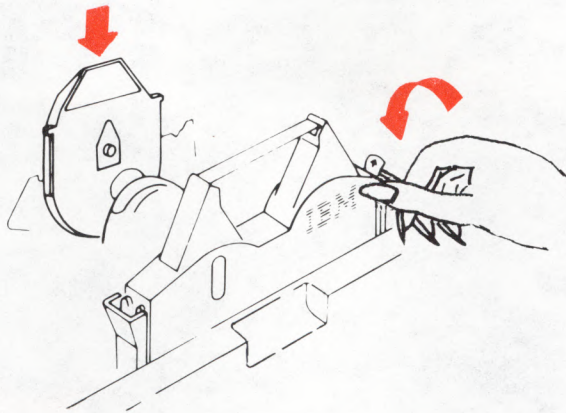


Grasp the printwheel cartridge handle and lift up.

Note: Before inserting another printwheel, make sure the printwheel is positioned correctly in the cartridge. If it is not correctly positioned, move the printwheel inside the cartridge until the printwheel looks like the illustration below.

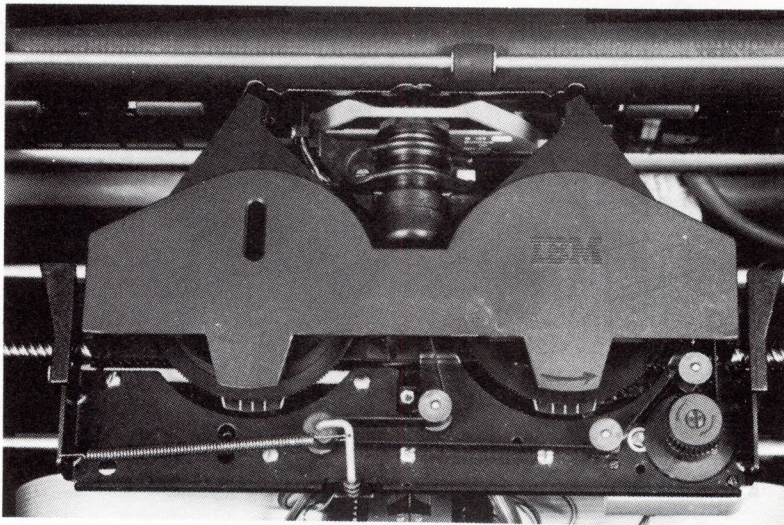


TO INSERT A PRINTWHEEL CARTRIDGE



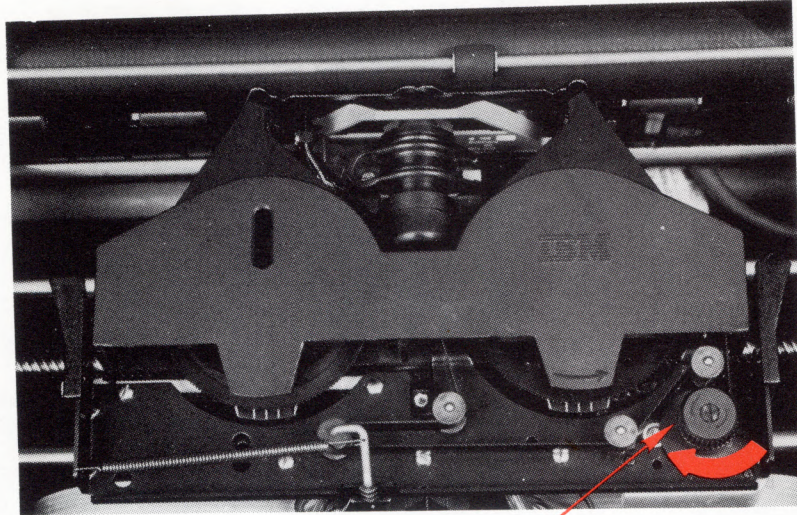
Place the printwheel cartridge in the upright position.

Insert the cartridge into the slot.



Lay the ribbon cartridge down to the print position. Do not press the top of the ribbon cartridge.

Make sure the ribbon is not caught in the printwheel.



Ribbon Advance Knob

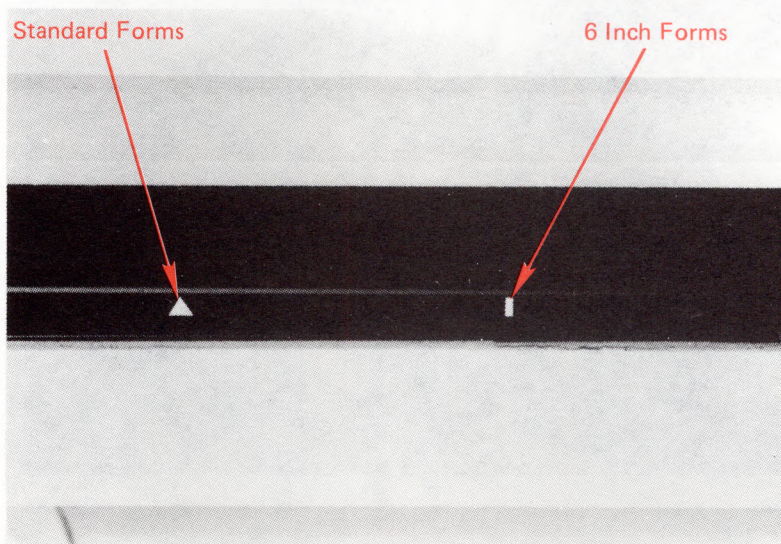
Turn the ribbon advance knob clockwise to remove any slack in the ribbon.
Close the printer cover and press Start.

CHAPTER 9. INSERTING CUT SHEET PAPER

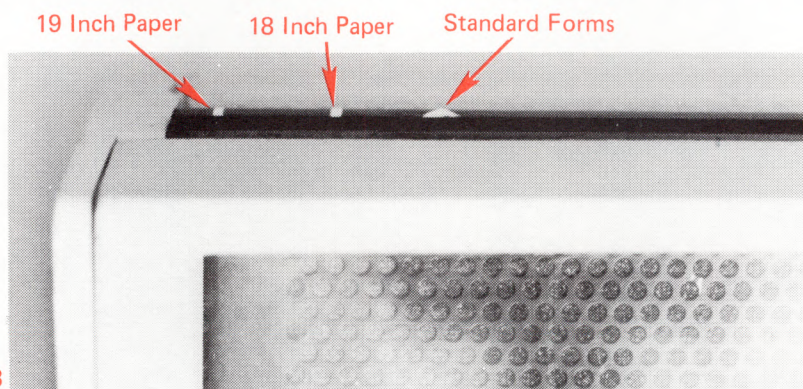
When you see the Load Cut Paper or Envelope Size (width x length) inches message on the display, it is time to load paper.

INSERTING CUT SHEET PAPER INTO A PRINTER WITHOUT A PAPER SUPPORT

TABLE



Locate the ▲ and the ■ on the top of the printer. IBM 5218

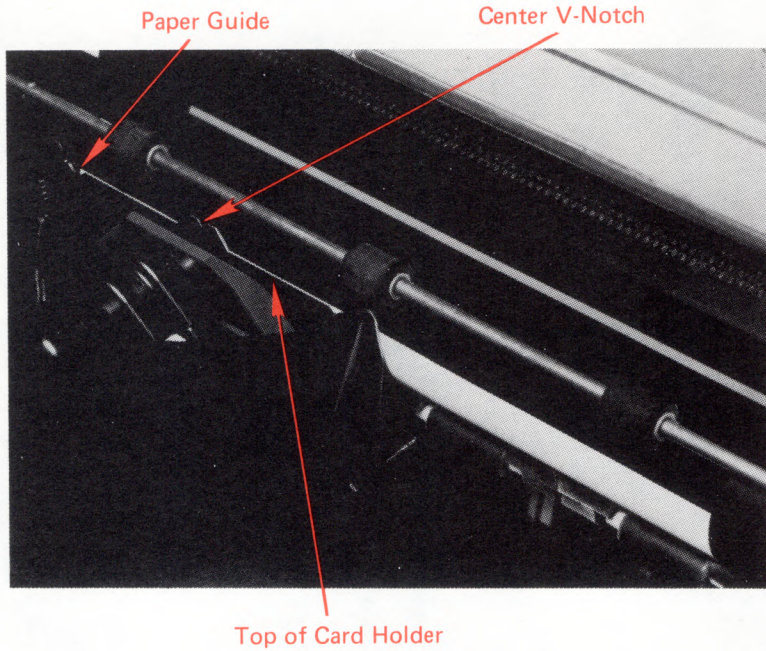


Align the left edge of the paper with the ▲ on the top of the printer. If your paper is less than 150 mm (6 inches) wide, use the ■ to align the left edge of the paper.

Note: On the IBM 5228 Printer, if you are using paper widths of 18 or 19 inches, the left edge of the paper should be aligned with the appropriate ■ to the left of the ▲ as shown at the beginning of this chapter. Then align the paper guide with the paper edge.

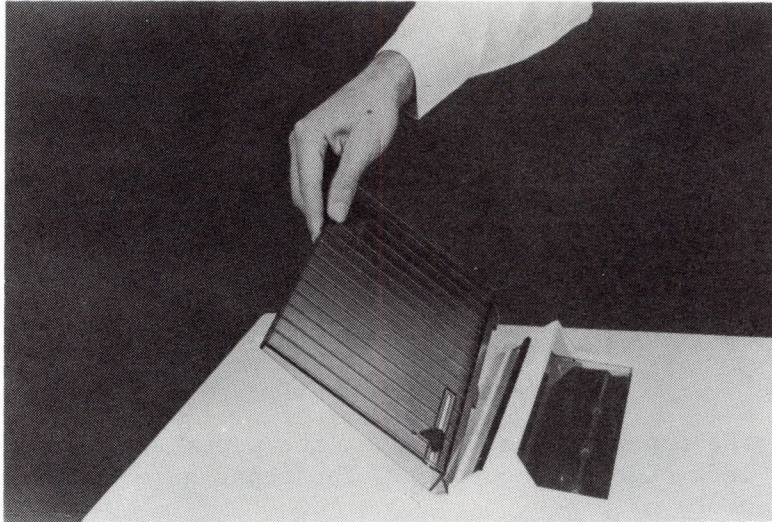
Press Load. The paper will index to the top of the cardholder.

The left V notch on the card holder indicates the first possible print position. The center V notch on the card holder indicates the first possible print position for paper less than 150 mm (6 inches) wide. If more precise horizontal alignment is required, press the RELEASE button and realign the paper.



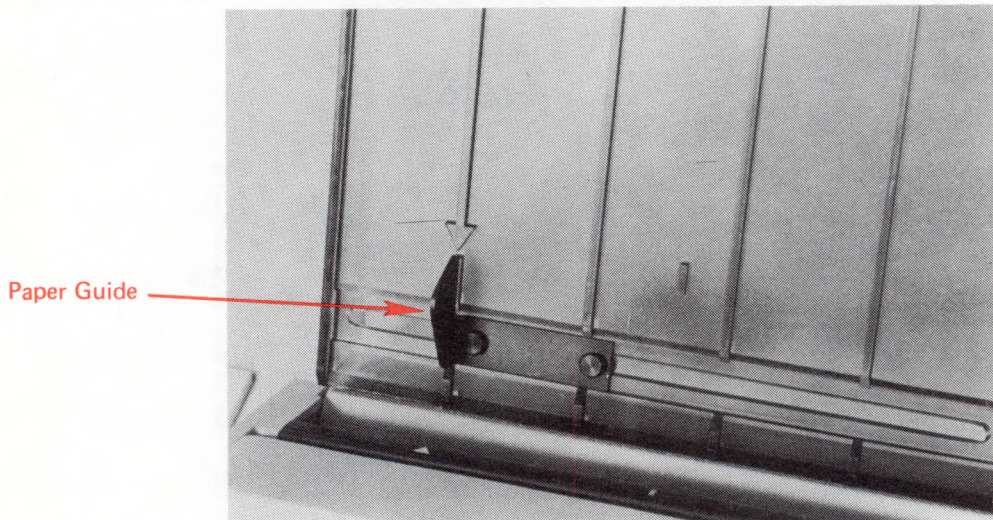
PAPER SUPPORT TABLE INSTALLATION

If you have a Paper Support Table, install the table as shown below, then insert paper:



Insert the tabs at the bottom of the Paper Support Table into the slot behind the paper entry bar.

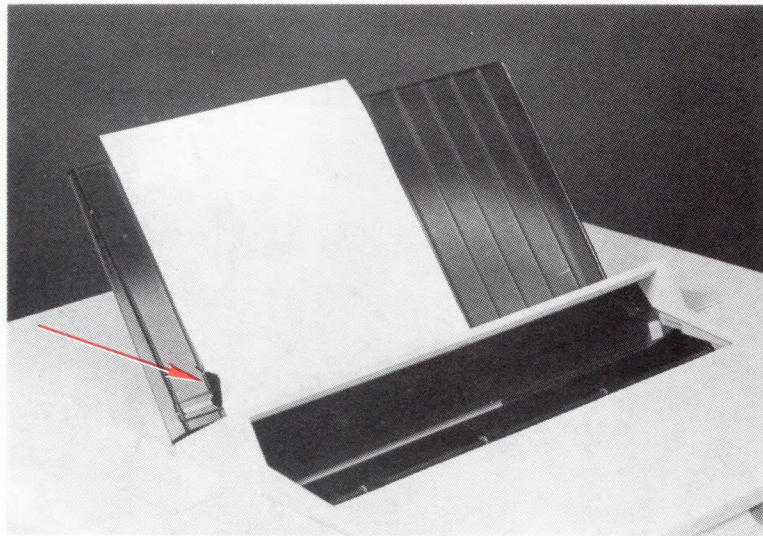
INSERTING PAPER WITH A PAPER SUPPORT TABLE ATTACHED





Locate the ↓ and the ■ on the paper support table.

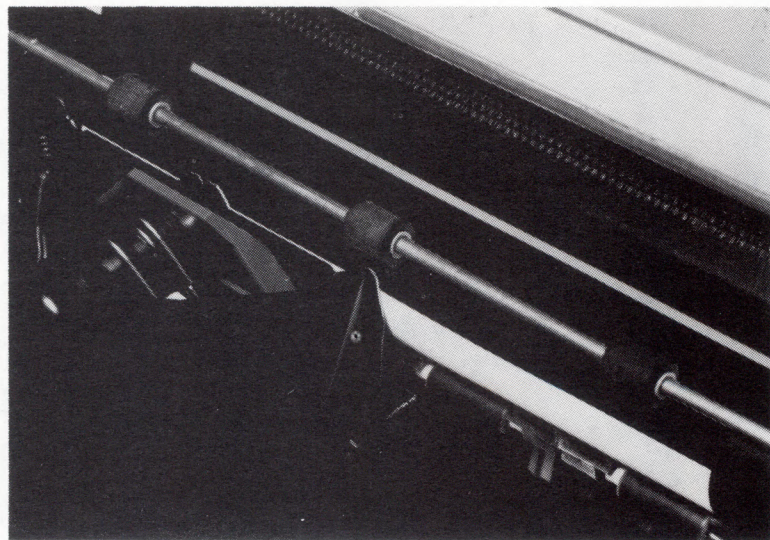
Slide the paper guide to the ↓. If paper is less than 150 mm (6 inches) wide, line up the paper guide with the ■ on the table.

Note: On the IBM 5228 Printer, if 18- or 19-inch paper is being used, the paper edge should be aligned with the marks on the acoustic filter and then align the paper guide with the paper edge. See the illustration at the beginning of this chapter for the location of the paper alignment marks on the 5228.



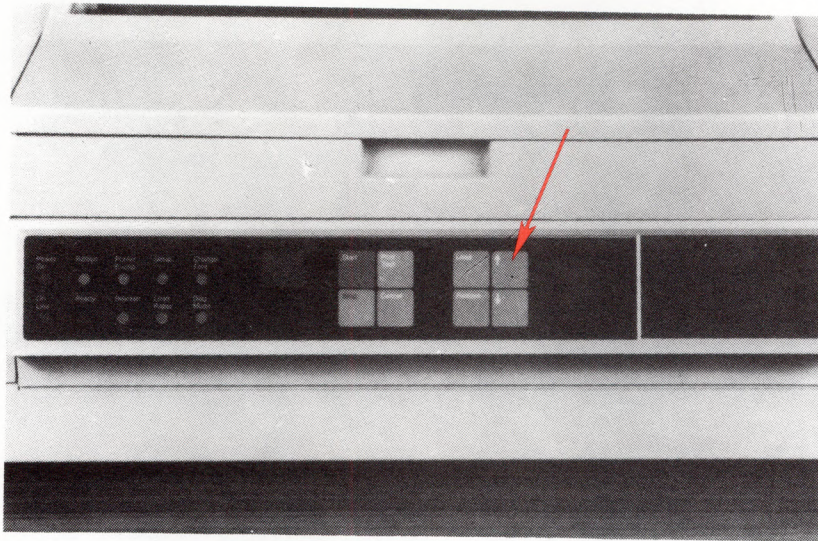
Align the left edge of the paper with the  on the paper table or the  on the table to line up the left edge of the paper. The paper guide can be used to position subsequent sheets of paper.


Press Load, and the paper will index to the top of the cardholder.



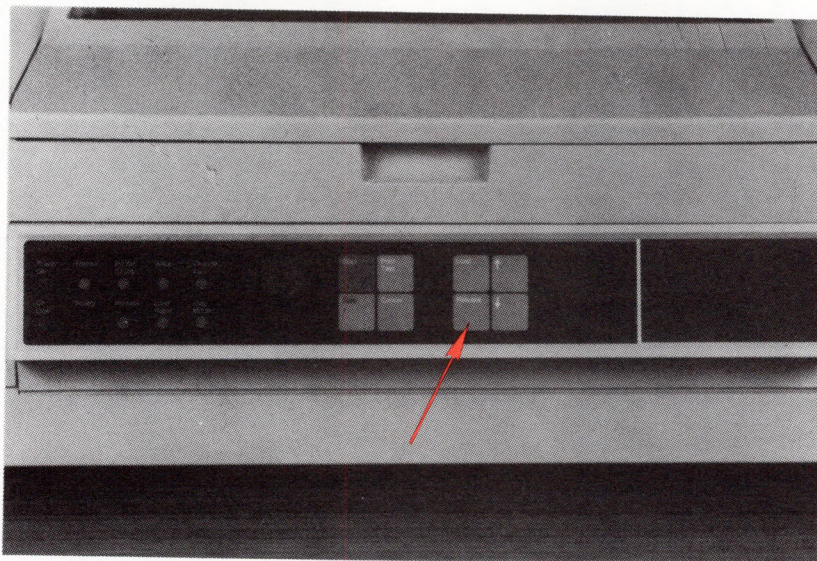
TO REMOVE CUT SHEET PAPER FROM THE PRINTER

To remove cut sheet paper from the printer, follow these steps:



Press and hold the  button until the paper indexes out of the printer.

OR



Press Release, remove the paper, and then press Release again.

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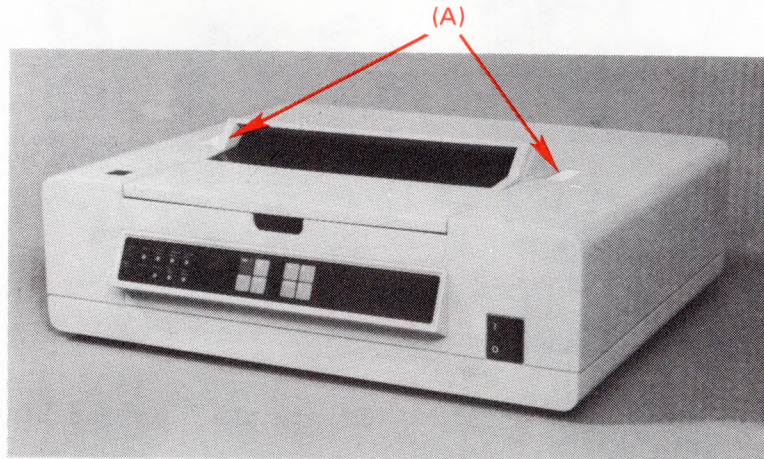
CHAPTER 10. IBM TRACTOR FEED

If the IBM Tractor Feed is needed to print continuous-form paper, you will learn in this chapter how to install and remove the Tractor Feed and how to install and remove paper from the Tractor Feed.

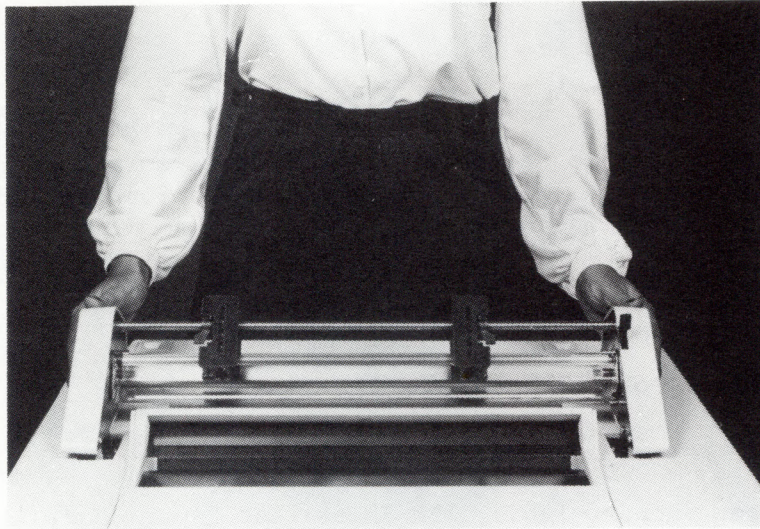
INSTALLING THE IBM TRACTOR FEED

To install the IBM Tractor Feed, follow these steps:

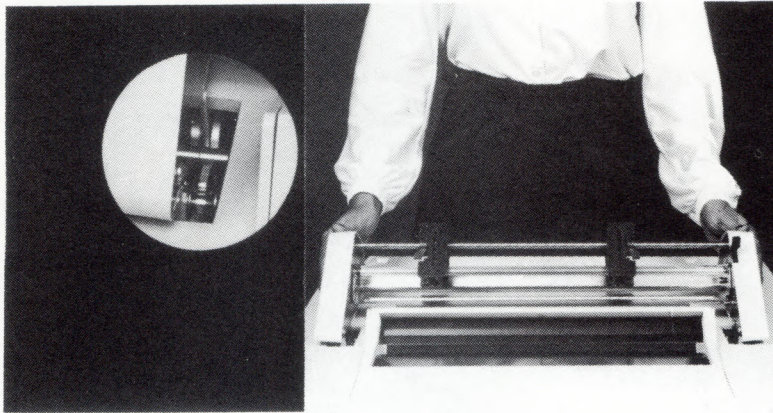
- Turn the printer power OFF (O).
- Remove the paper Support Table, IBM Sheet-Feed Paper Handler, or IBM Front Exit Sheet Feed if installed.
- Slide the printer to the rear edge of the table.



Remove the cover inserts (A) if they are in place.

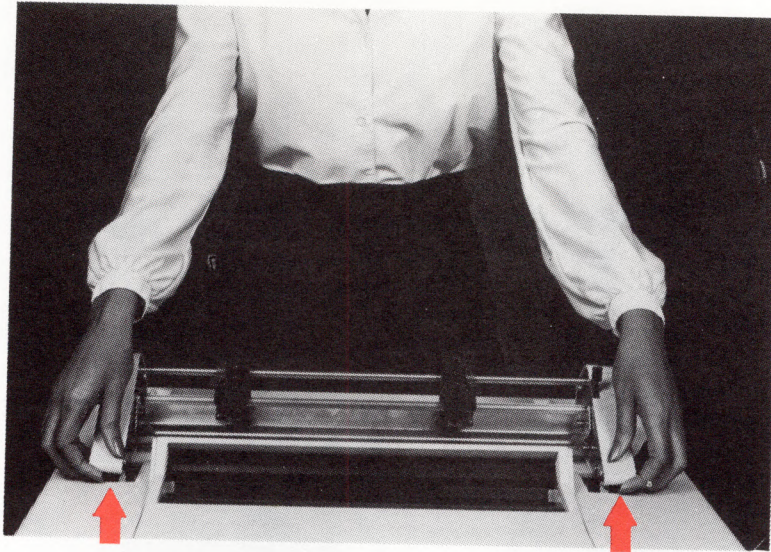


Place the IBM Tractor Feed onto the printer.

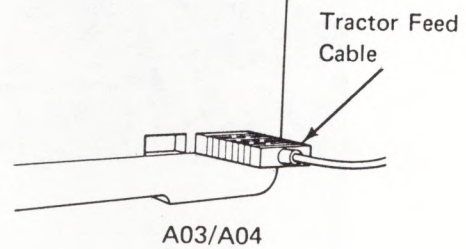
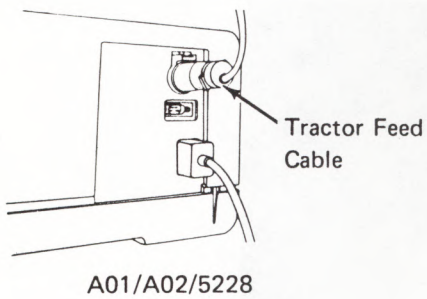


Insert the front pins into the front slots on both the left and right sides of the tractor feed mechanism.

Rotate the IBM Tractor Feed back until it rests on the printer cover.

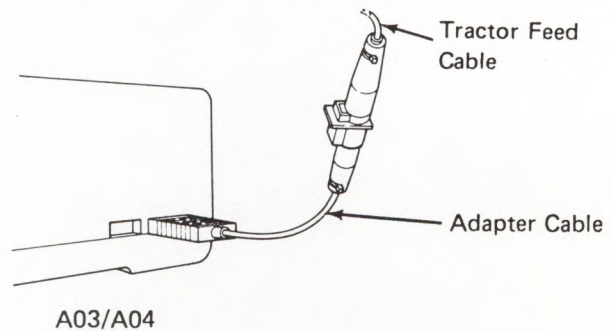
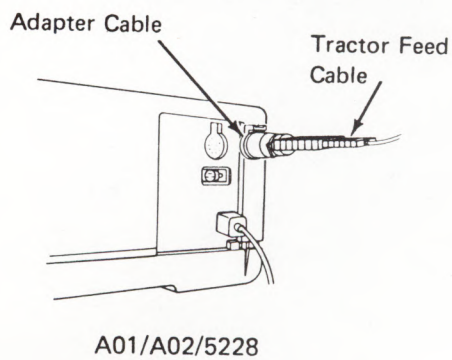


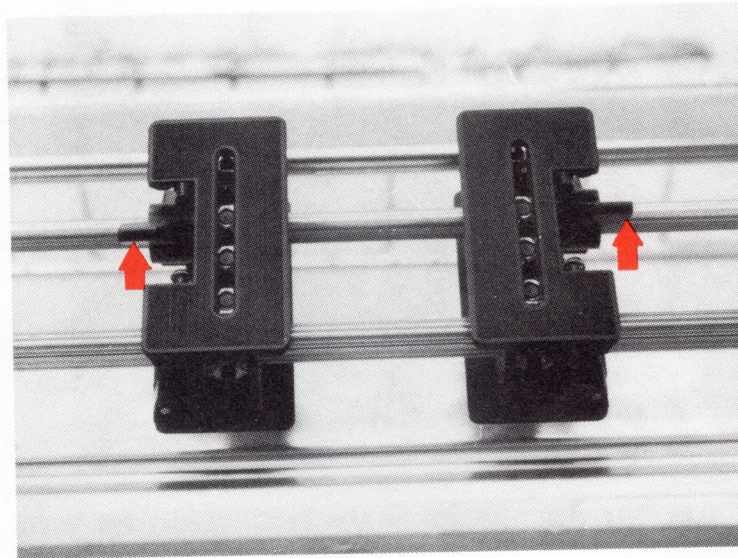
To make sure the IBM Tractor Feed is properly installed, lift the front of the device. If the IBM Tractor Feed lifts away from the printer, follow the previous steps to re-install.



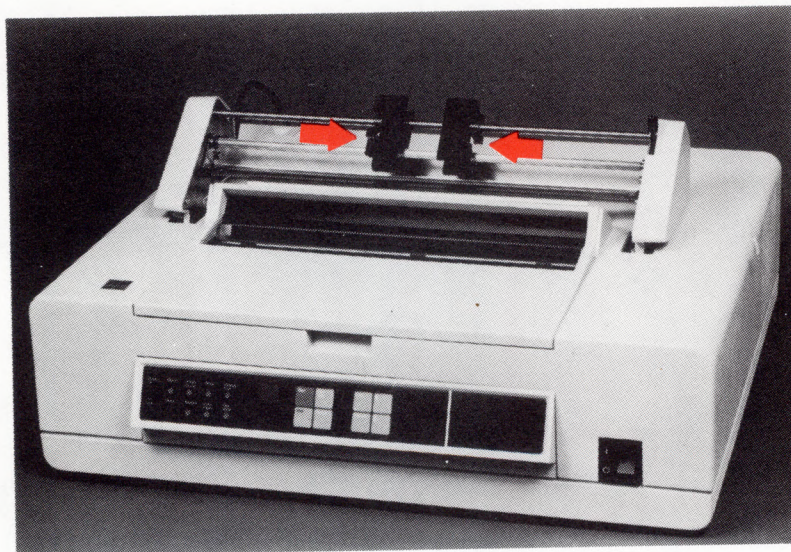

CHAPTER 11. IBM SHEET-FEED PAPER HANDLER

The IBM Sheet-Feed Paper Handler is an automatic paper handling device available for the IBM 5218/IBM 5228 Printwheel Printer. The paper handler has two input paper trays each of which holds approximately 200 cut sheets of 20-pound paper. The output tray will hold approximately 400 sheets of 20-pound paper.

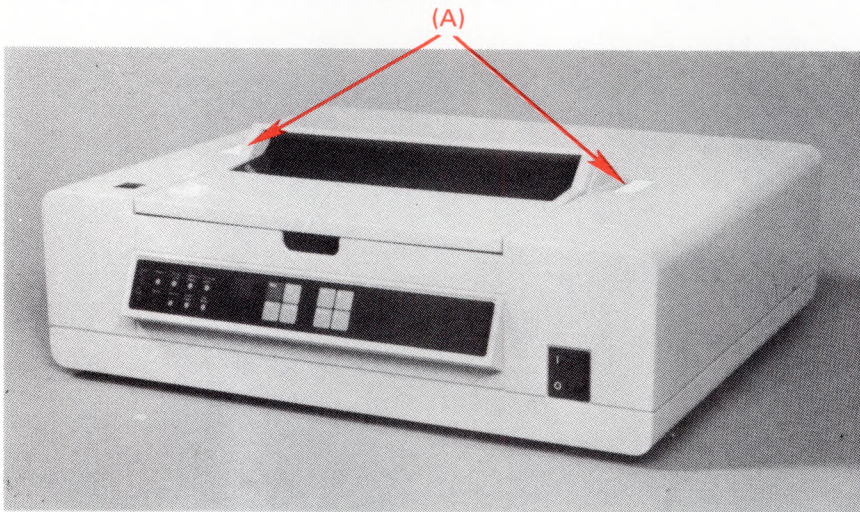
Note: Read the Paper Specifications and Environmental Conditions described in "Appendix G".

INSTALLATION OF THE IBM SHEET-FEED PAPER HANDLER

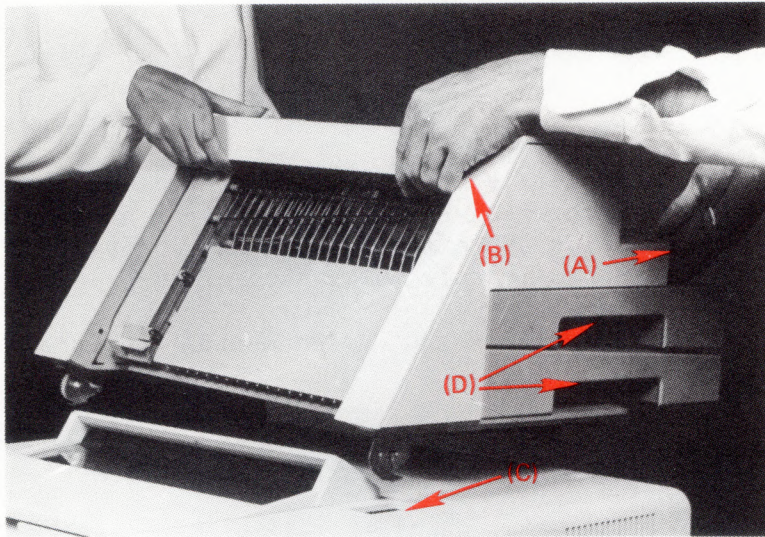
To install the IBM Sheet-Feed Paper Handler, follow these instructions:

Note: Because the IBM Sheet-Feed Paper Handler weighs approximately 12 kg (26.4 pounds), two people are recommended to install it.

- Turn the printer power OFF (O). Remove the Paper Support Table (Chapter 9) or IBM Tractor Feed (Chapter 10) if installed.



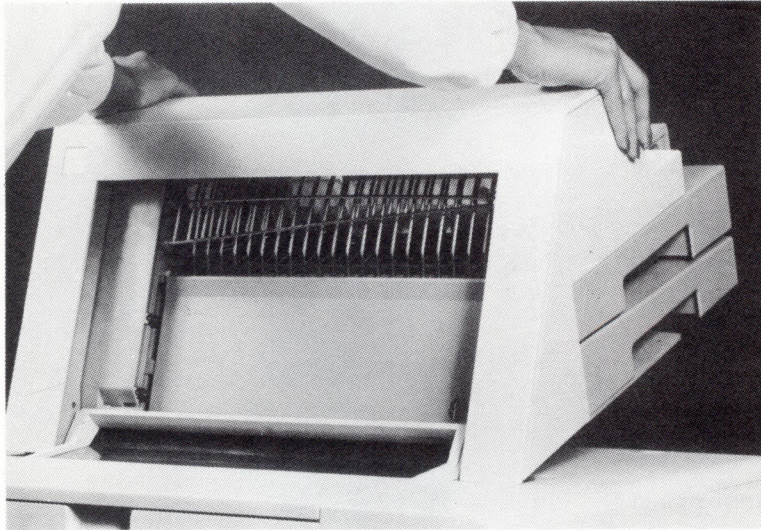
Remove the cover inserts if they are in place (A).



With a person on each side of the IBM Sheet-Feed Paper Handler, facing each other, place hands in the hand scoops (A) and on the front edges (B) of the cover to place the device level on top of the printer.

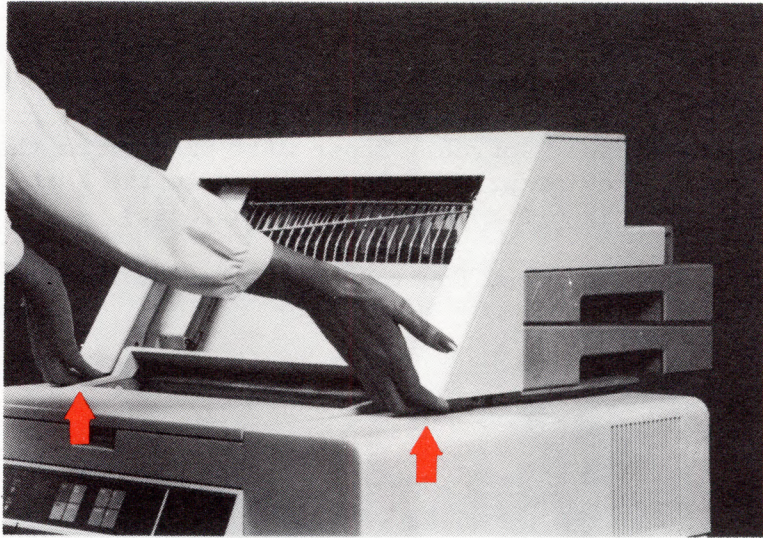

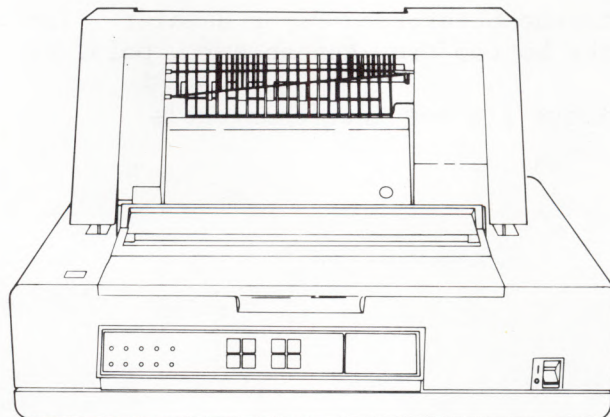
To make sure the Sheet-Feed Paper Handler is installed correctly, try to lift the device at both front corners. If the Sheet-Feed Paper Handler lifts away from the printer, return to the previous steps.

Connect the IBM Sheet-Feed Paper Handler cable plug into the printer cable socket.

Note: To connect the Sheet Feed Paper Handler to the A03 or A04 models, an adapter cable is required.

Turn printer power ON (I).

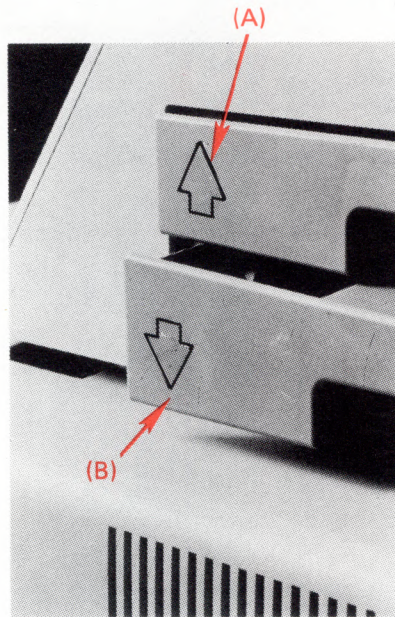

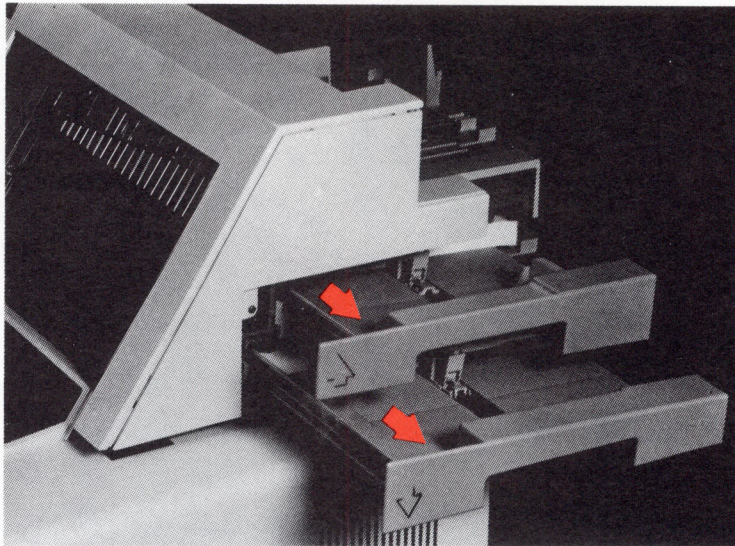
The IBM Displaywriter will allow you to choose which paper tray you will print from. When the PAGE FORMAT menu appears on the screen, make the proper selection for your printing paper source. Paper will print from that tray until another selection is made. Review printing procedures in the Work Station Procedures Guide. (See Appendix G for paper specifications.)

To load paper into the IBM Sheet-Feed Paper Handler, follow the steps and illustrations below:

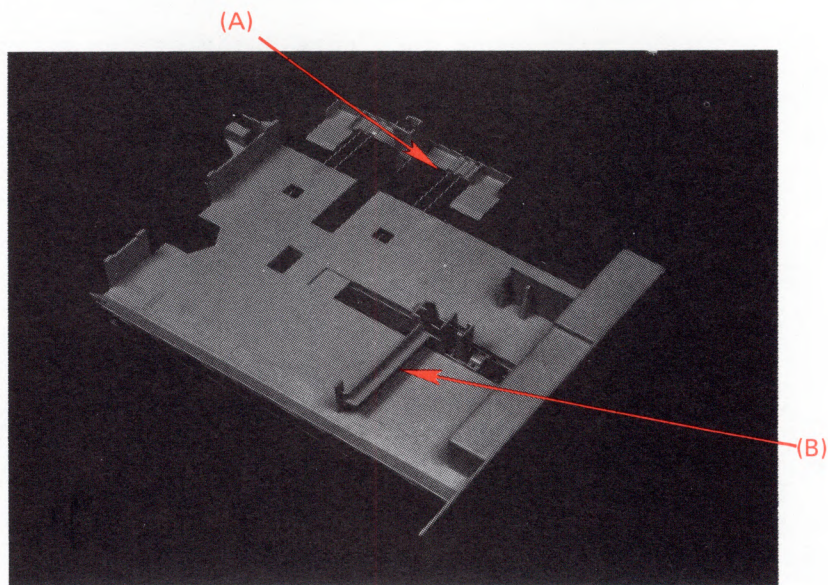

You may need to feed a cut sheet of paper or an envelope through the IBM 5218/IBM 5228 Printwheel Printer while the IBM Sheet-Feed Paper Handler is attached. To do this, follow these instructions:



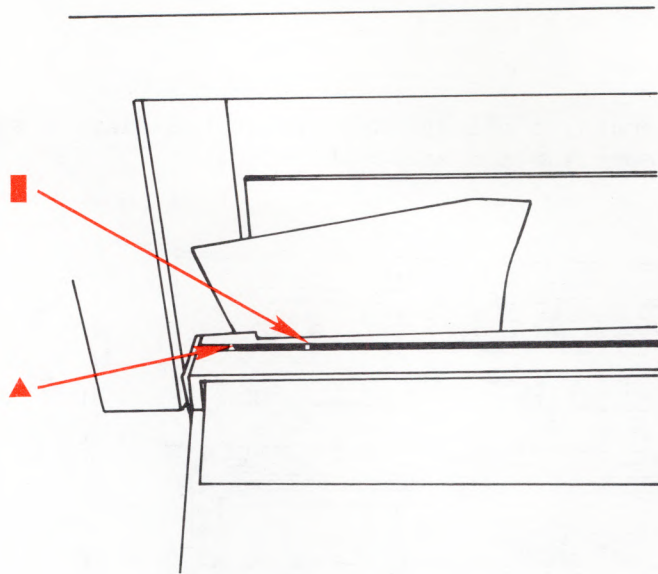
Rotate the paper insertion gate to the manual feed position as shown.

Place the paper behind the paper insertion gate and into the opening in the printer cover (A).

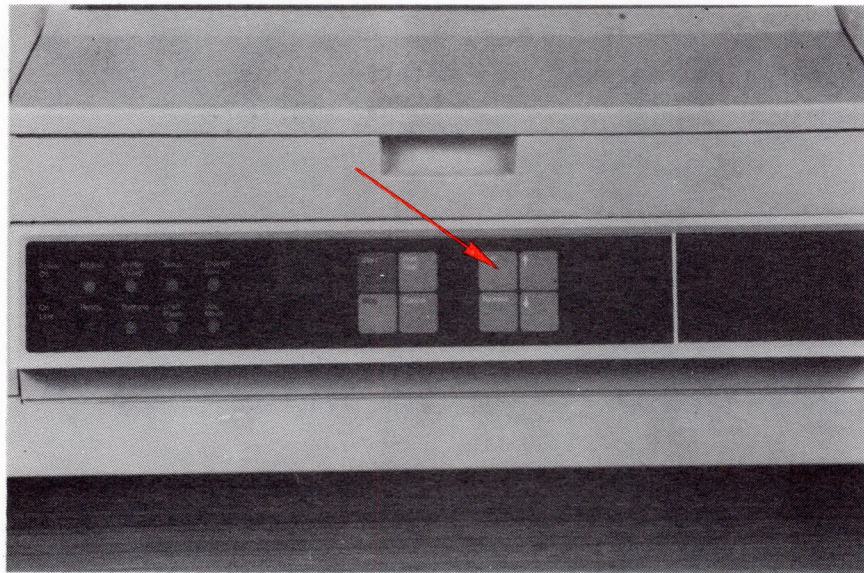


Note: On the IBM 5228 Printer, the splitter should be raised into the vertical position for paper extending beyond the right edge of the splitter opening.

The splitter and the paper insertion gate must be manually returned to their original positions for automatic operation.



Locate the ▲ and ■ marks on the top of the printer. Align the left edge of the paper with the ▲ on the top of the printer. If the paper width is less than 150 mm (6 inches), use the ■ to align the left edge of the paper. On the IBM 5228 Printer, when using paper widths of 18 or 19 inches, the left edge of the paper should be aligned with the appropriate ■ to the left of the ▲ (See the illustration at the beginning of Chapter 9.)



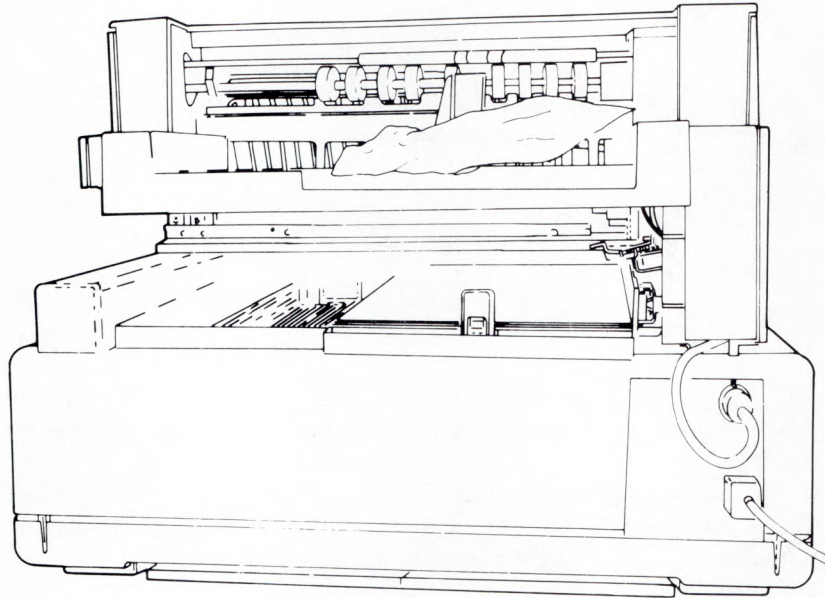

Two people are required to remove the IBM Sheet-Feed Paper Handler. With the two people facing each other on opposite sides of the device, use the hand scoops (A) and the front edge (B) of the IBM Sheet-Feed Paper Handler cover to tilt the device forward. Lift the device straight up and away until the latches (C) are clear of the printer cover openings.

Note: Do not lift by the paper tray handles (D).

Store the IBM Sheet-Feed Paper Handler in a safe place.

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CHAPTER 12. IBM FRONT EXIT SHEET FEED

The IBM Front Exit Sheet Feed is an automatic paper/envelope handling device available only for the IBM 5218 Printer. The IBM Front Exit Sheet Feed is available as a paper only feature or as a paper and envelope feature. The front exit sheet feed has two input paper trays each capable of holding approximately 200 cut sheets of 20-pound paper. The paper and envelope feature also is capable of holding approximately 100 envelopes. The paper output tray holds approximately 400 sheets of 20-pound paper and the envelope output tray holds approximately 100 envelopes.

Note: Paper and envelope specifications are described in "Appendix G".

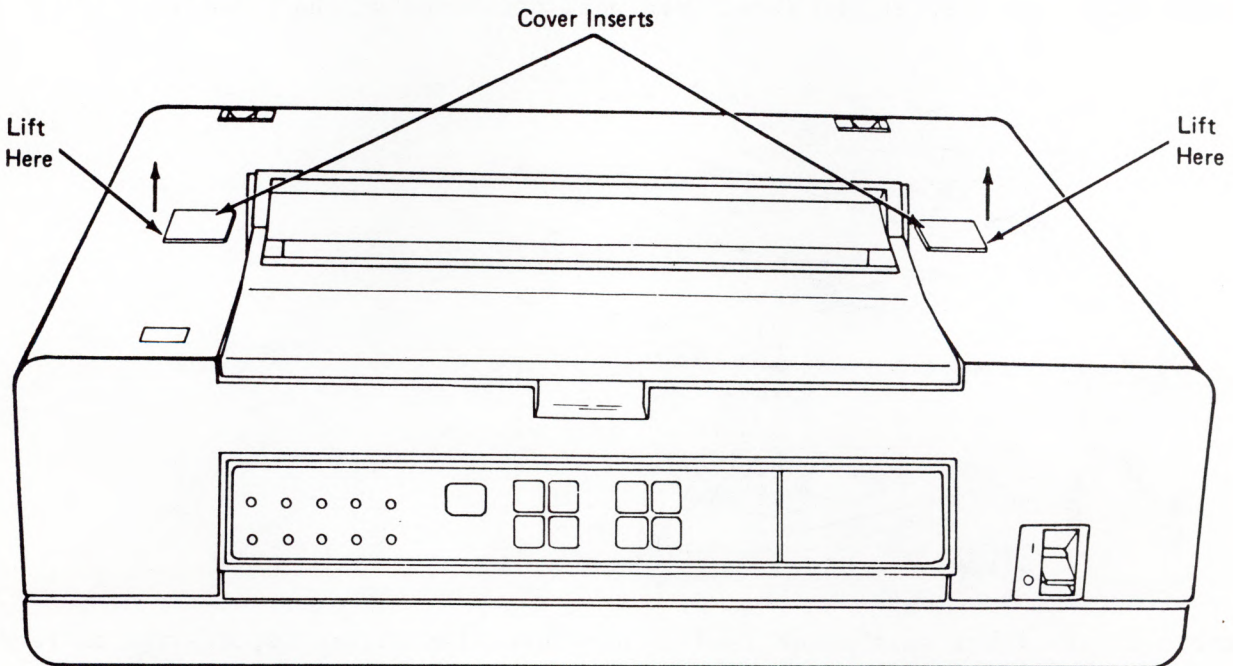
INSTALLATION OF THE IBM FRONT EXIT SHEET FEED

To install the IBM Front Exit Sheet Feed, follow these instructions:

CAUTION

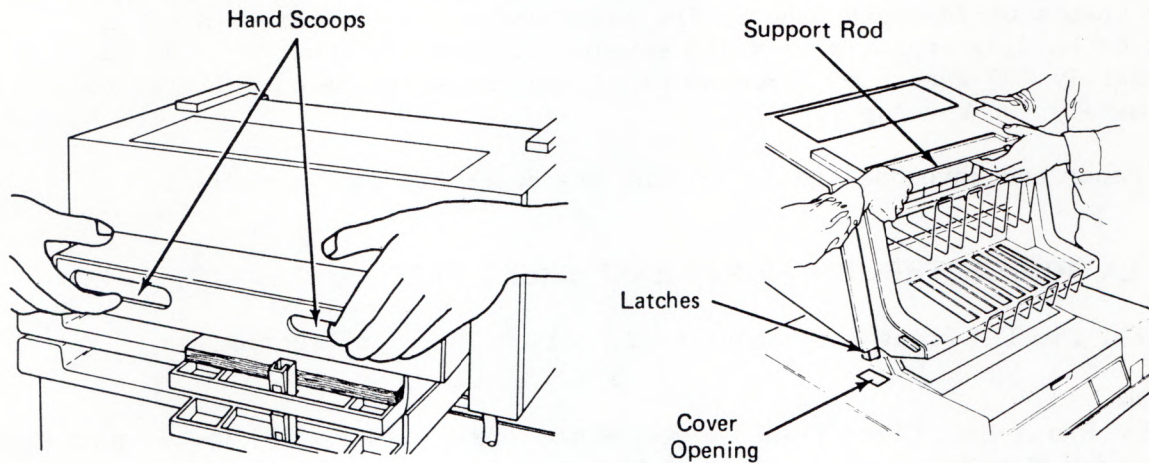
Your IBM Front Exit Sheet Feed weighs approximately 14 kg (31 lbs.) and it is recommended that two people attach it to the printer.

- Turn the printer power Off (0). Remove the Paper Support Table (Chapter 9) or Tractor Feed (Chapter 10) if installed.
- Lift out the cover inserts if they are in place.



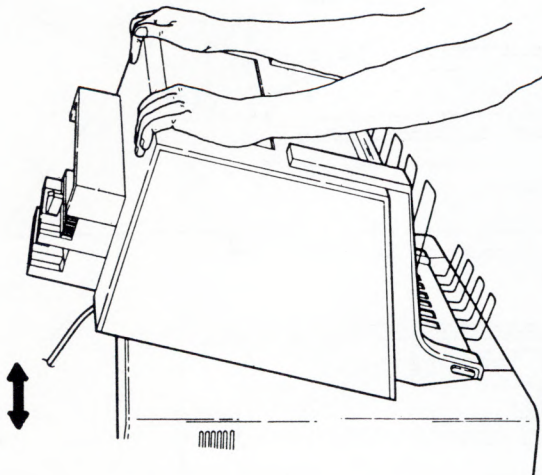
Ensure that all of the paper and envelopes are removed from the paper trays, envelope tray and the output tray. With two people facing each other on opposite sides of the sheet feed, use the the hand scoops and the metal support rod behind the envelope output tray to lower the sheet feed flat on top of the printer with the latches inserted in the printer cover openings.

Warning: Do not lift by the paper tray handles or the output tray. You may damage the trays.



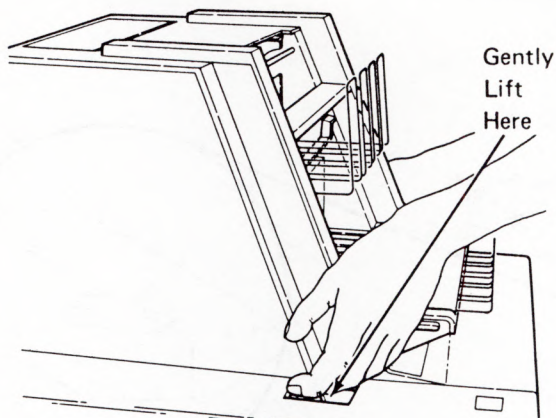
To properly engage the front exit sheet feed, one person standing in front of the sheet feed must tilt the IBM Front Exit Sheet Feed forward approximately 75 to 100 mm (3 to 4 in.) until both sides latch or click into position.

Slowly lower the rear of the sheet feed until it rests on the printer.



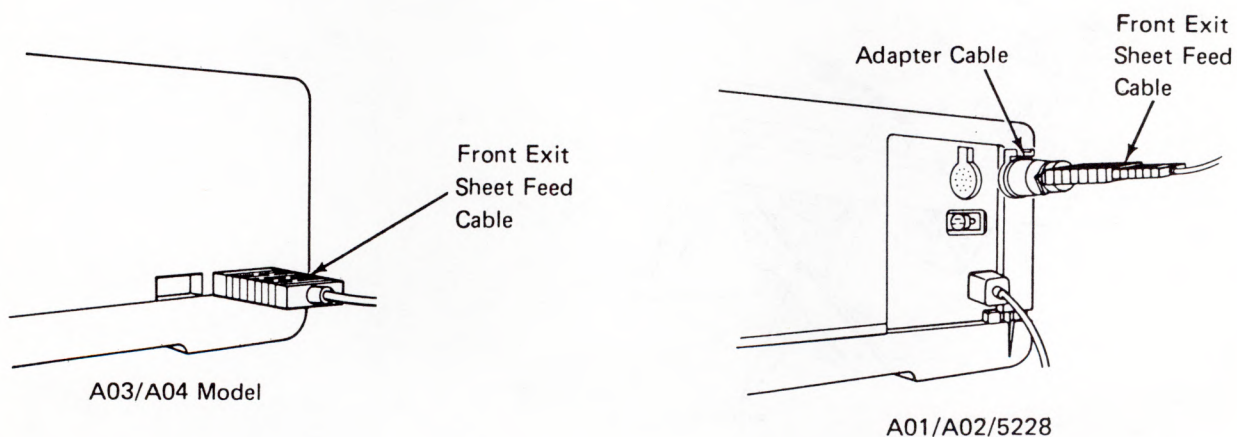
Note: If the front exit sheet feed is not installed correctly, a paper or feed failure will occur.

To check for correct installation, attempt to gently lift the sheet feed at both front corners. If either corner of the sheet feed moves away from the printer, repeat the previous steps.



Ensure that the printer is Off (0). Connect the front exit sheet feed cable to the rear of the printer.

Note: Some printers require an adapter cable to connect the sheet feed to the printer. If an adapter is required, install it as shown below.



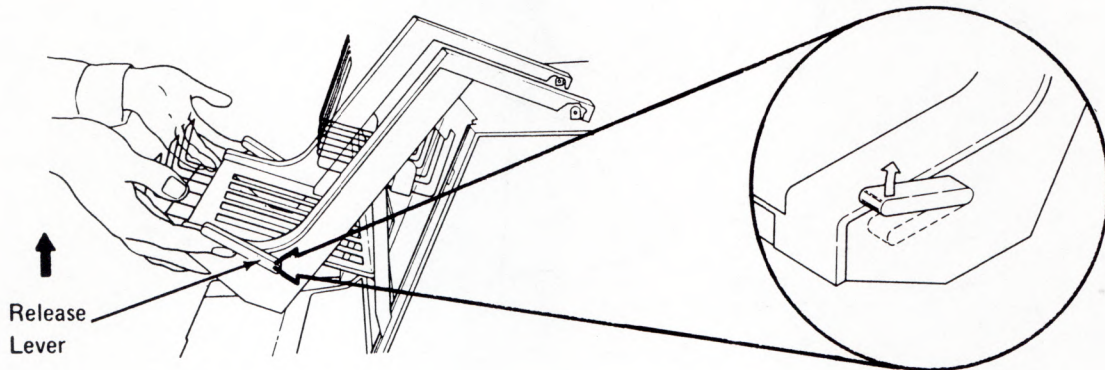

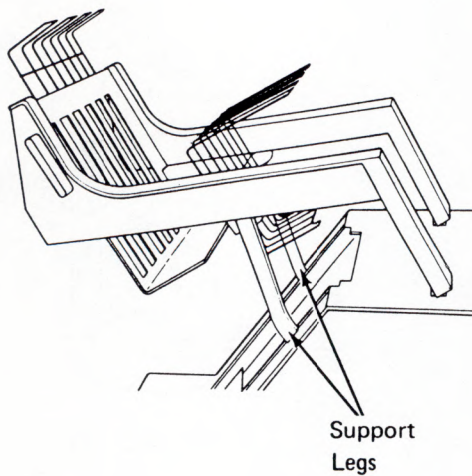

To gain access to the front paper path and the printer, lift the output tray to its raised position. To lift the output tray to the raised position, do the following:

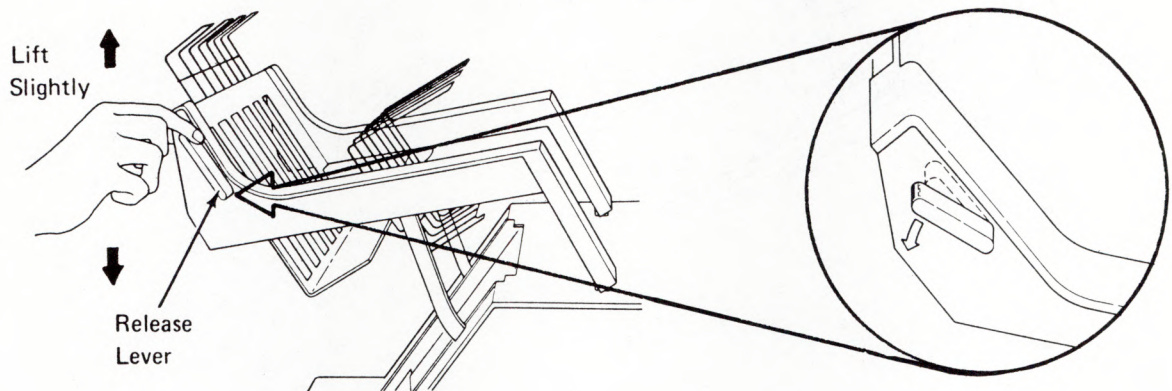

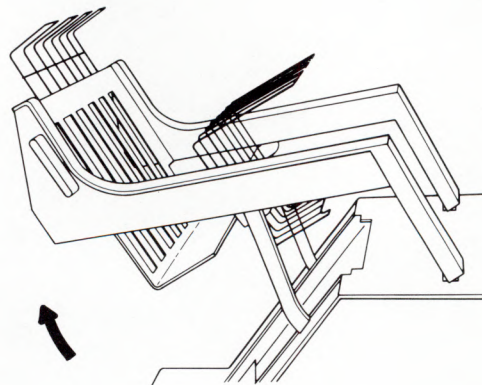
Ensure that your fingers are not between the output tray and the front exit sheet feed when you lower the tray.

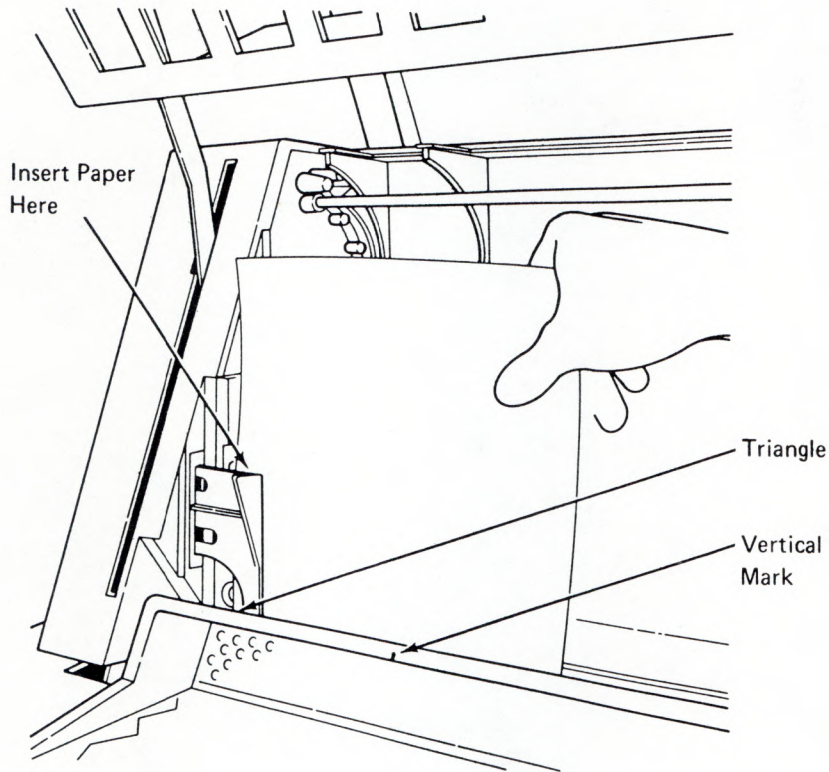
Lift the pressure roller up to its manual feed position.

Place the paper into the opening in the printer cover (behind the insertion guide). Use the triangle on the printer to align the left edge of the paper or envelope. The vertical mark on the printer indicates the approximate left edge for paper or envelope less than 150 mm (6 in.) wide. Paper or envelopes must be inserted until they stop against the alignment tabs inside the printer.



Press **Stop**, then press **Load** to feed the paper or envelope to the print position. Press **Start** to print on the paper or envelope.

Note: When you return to the automatic sheet feed operation, you must push the insertion guide to the left until it stops and is clear of the paper path and then rotate the pressure roller back to the automatic position. Lower the output tray and latch it in the down position. If the output is not completely down and latched, a paper jam may occur when the next sheet of paper or envelope is ejected.

LOADING PAPER AND ENVELOPES INTO THE IBM FRONT EXIT SHEET FEED

The IBM Displaywriter allows you to choose which paper tray you print from. When the PAGE FORMAT menu appears on the screen, make the proper selection for printing paper source. Paper prints from that tray until another selection is made. Review printing procedures in the Work Station Procedures Guide.

Supplies should be stored in the same environment as the machine. If you cannot keep all of the supplies in the same environment, you should store a sufficient supply of paper and envelopes in the operating environment for at least 24 hours prior to use. Proper paper and envelope selection and environmental conditions will help the printer perform at its optimum level. (See Appendix G for paper and envelope specifications.)

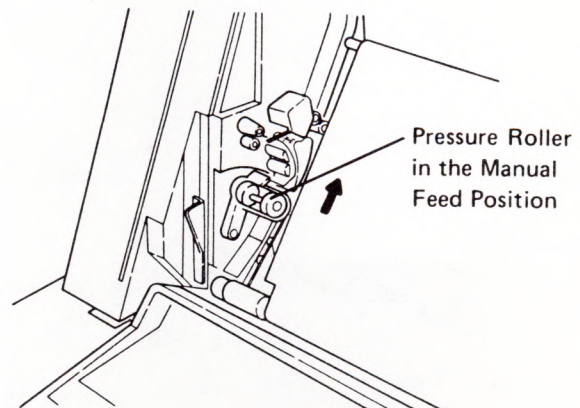
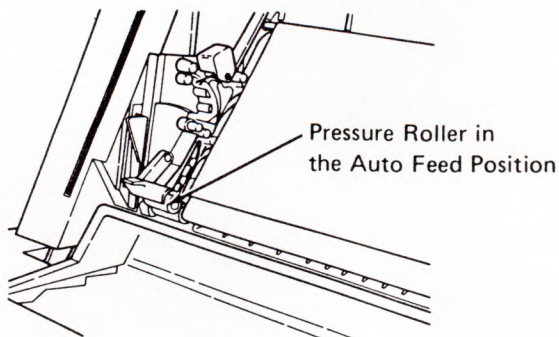
Loading Paper In The IBM Front Exit Sheet Feed

Ensure that the front exit sheet feed is installed on the printer before loading paper. If the front exit sheet feed is not installed, refer to page 105 "Installation of the IBM Front Exit Sheet Feed".

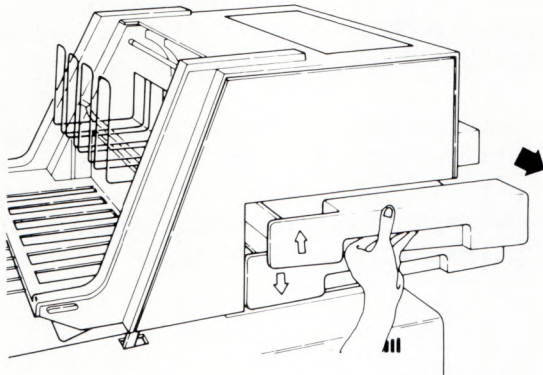
The sheet feed has two paper supply trays. These trays are not interchangeable. The top tray has an arrow pointing up. The bottom tray has an arrow pointing down. Each tray can hold approximately 200 cut sheets of 75 gm/m² (20 lb.) paper. (See Appendix G for supplies information.)

To load paper, perform the following steps:

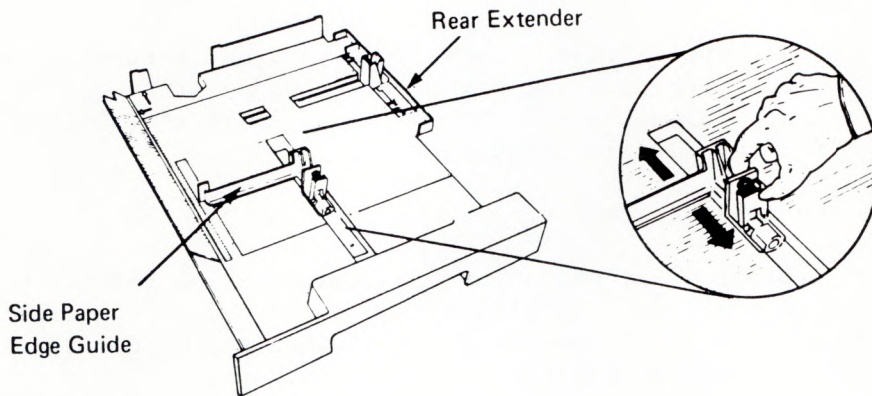
Ensure that the pressure roller is in the automatic feed position and the output tray is latched in the down position. If either of these mechanisms are not in the proper position, an error code 05 (paper jam) will display on the printer two-digit display after the next job prints.



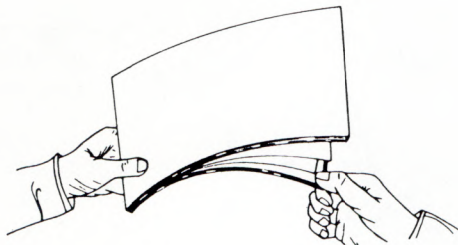
Remove the paper trays from the sheet feed, and set them on a flat surface such as a table top.



Slide the rear extender and side paper edge guides out far enough to accommodate your paper.



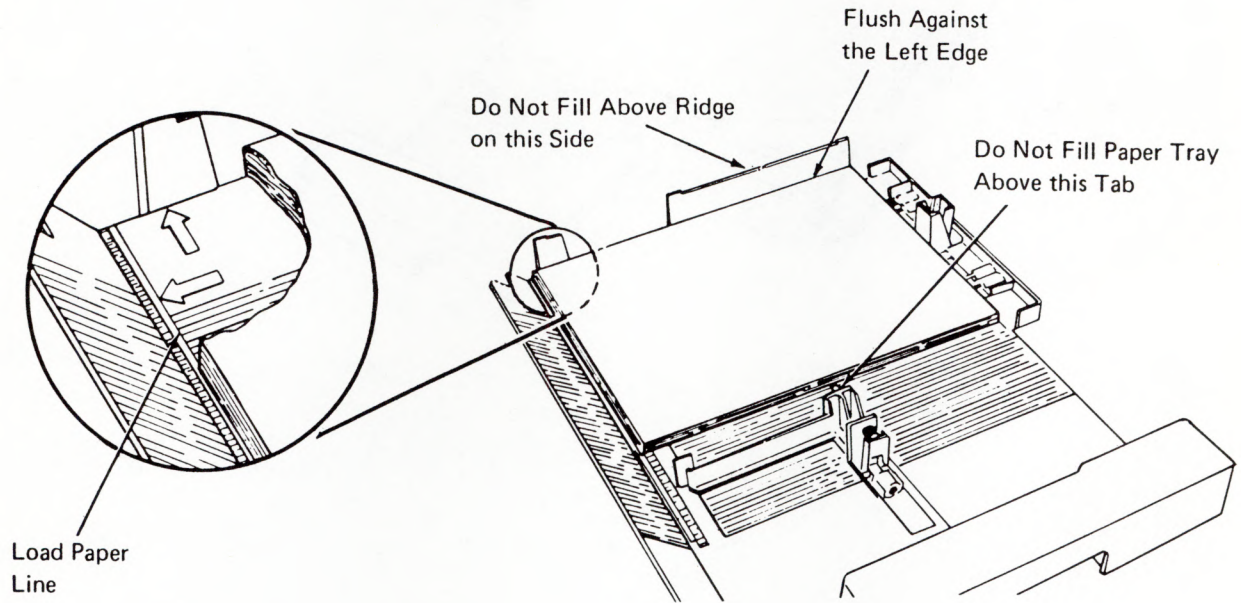
Fan the paper.



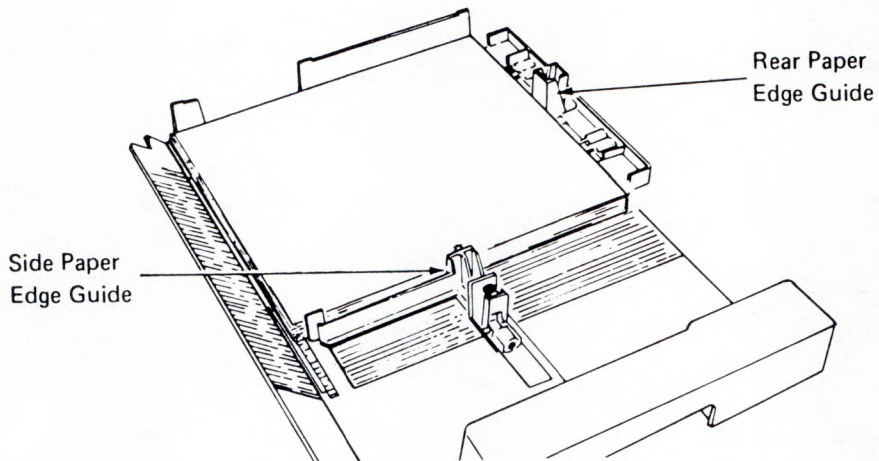
Insert the paper so that:

- The side to be printed faces down.
- The top edge of the paper is toward the front of the printer.
- The paper is flush against the left edge of the paper tray.
- The edge of the paper lies on the load paper line.
- The paper stack is not higher than the tab on the paper edge guide and the ridge on the tray side wall. If you put in too much paper, it will not feed correctly.

Note: Loading paper in front of or behind the load paper line may result in a feed failure caused by feeding more than one sheet at a time.



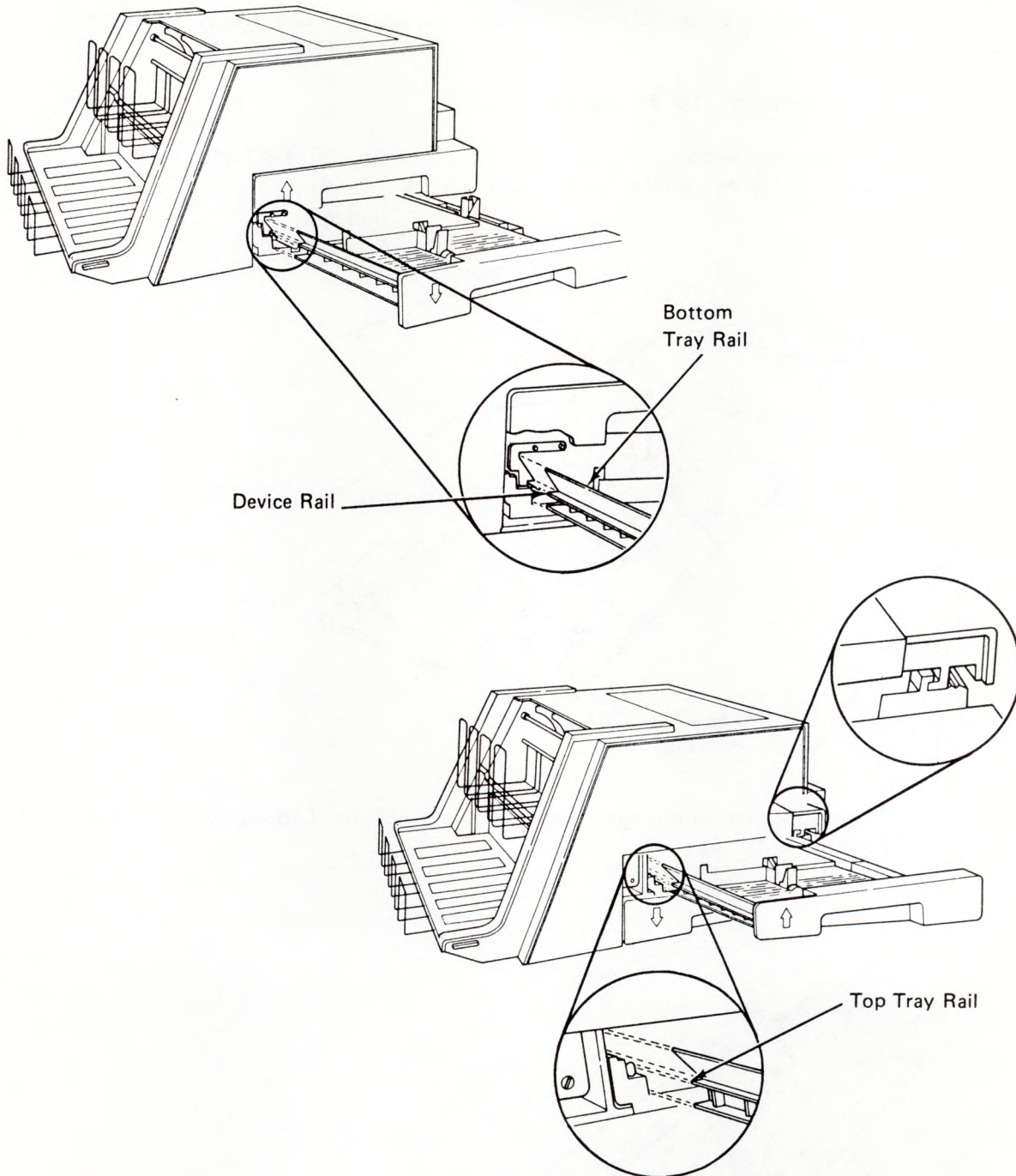
Slide the rear paper edge guide up **loosely** against the rear edge of the paper stack. Slide the side paper edge guide up **loosely** against the edge of the paper stack.



Note: If the side paper edge guide is placed too tightly against the paper stack, it may restrict paper motion and not allow the paper to enter the printer. If the side paper edge guide is placed too loosely against the paper stack, the paper may skew as it leaves the paper tray, causing paper jamming or skewed printing.

Note: The top and bottom trays are not interchangeable. The top tray has an arrow pointing up. The bottom tray has an arrow pointing down.

Slide the paper tray into the sheet feed until the tray clicks into position. Ensure that the tray fits into the sheet feed as shown.



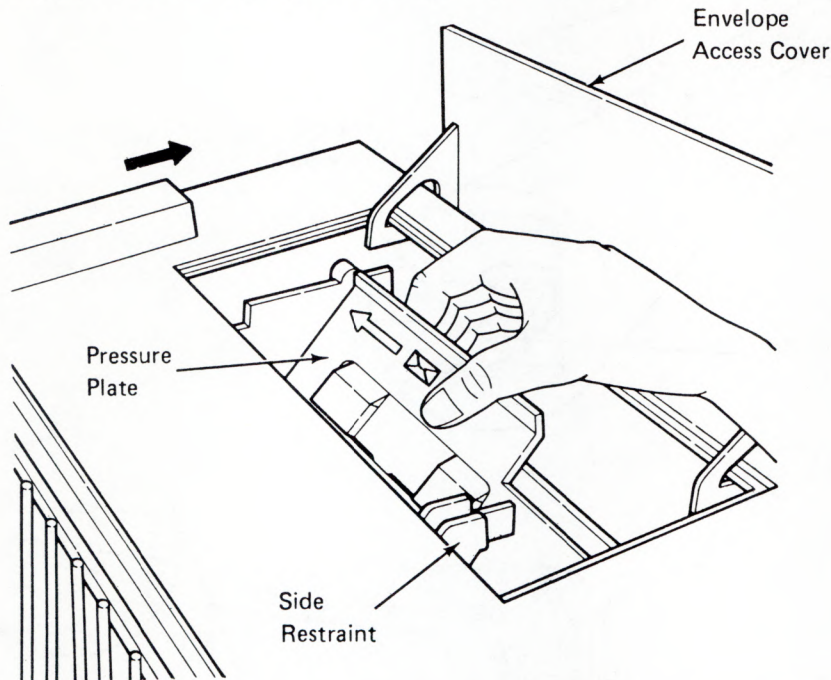
Loading Envelopes In The IBM Front Exit Sheet Feed

If your IBM Front Exit Sheet Feed feeds both paper and envelopes, this section describes how to load envelopes. The envelope tray holds approximately 100 envelopes.

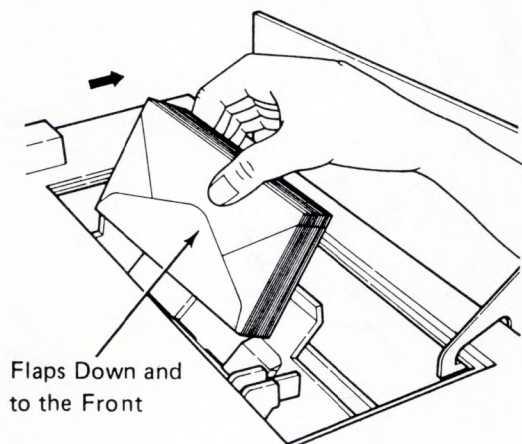
Note: It is easier to load envelopes while standing at the right side of the printer.

To load envelopes, perform the following steps:

Lift the envelope access cover, and slide the pressure plate back to its rear-most position. The pressure plate latches in place.

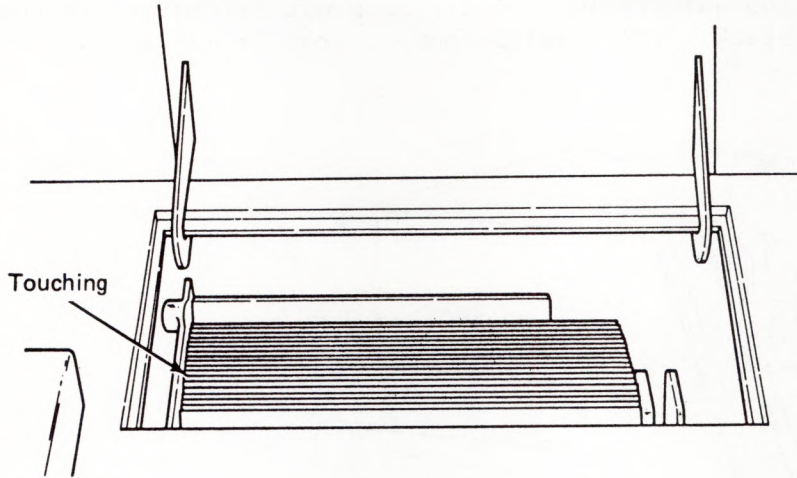


Place the envelopes in the envelope tray with the flaps facing down and towards the front of the sheet feed.

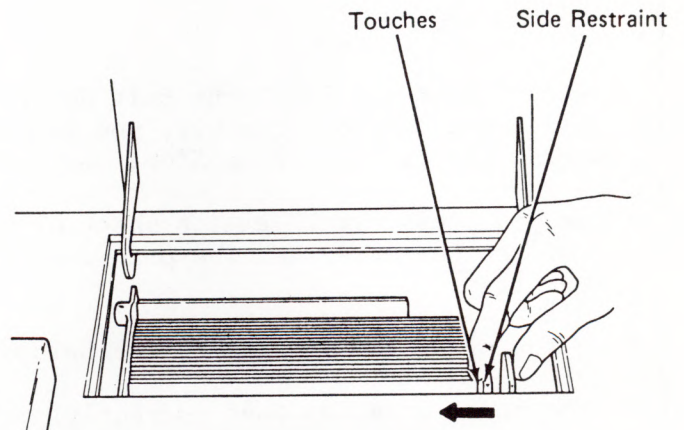
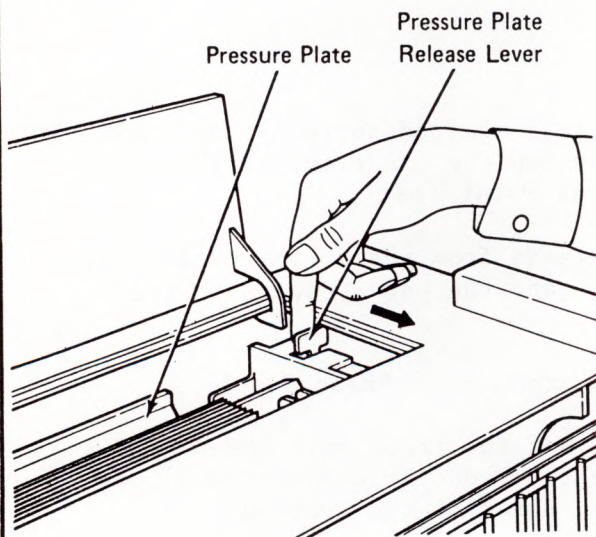


Ensure that the stack of envelopes is uniform and that the envelopes touch the left side wall and the bottom of the envelope tray.

Note: Envelopes will not feed correctly if you mix various envelope sizes and weights.



Move the pressure plate release lever forward to release the pressure plate as shown below. Squeeze the right side restraint and position it so that it lightly touches the envelopes.

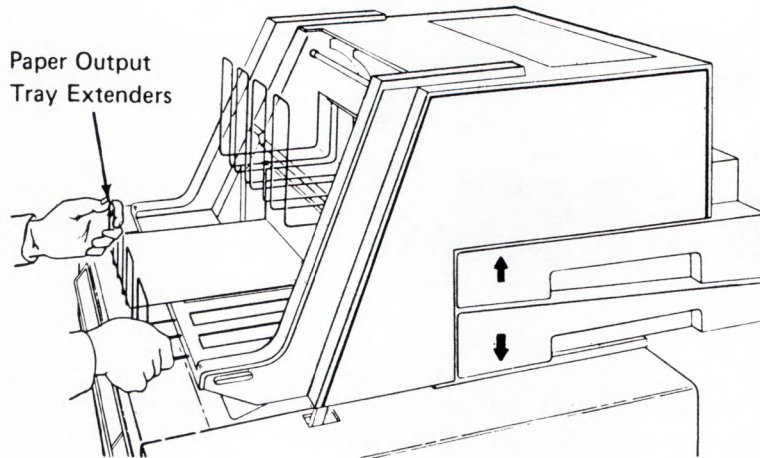


Close the envelope access cover.

Note: Maintaining a neat and uniform stack while loading envelopes will result in a more reliable envelope feed operation.

ADJUSTING THE PAPER OUTPUT TRAY

Place a sheet of paper in the paper output tray that is the same size and faces the same direction as the sheets in the paper input trays. The rear edge of the sheet should be against the rear of the output tray. While holding the tray extenders from both sides, slide the adjustable paper tray extender, in or out, so that it touches the front of the sheet. If sheets of different length are used, the adjustable front tray extender must be adjusted to accommodate the longest sheet. Ensure that the adjustable extender does not extend any farther than necessary for a neater stack. The envelope output tray is not adjustable.



To ensure that the IBM Front Exit Sheet Feed is installed correctly and that the supplies are loaded correctly, you may want to run the print test. (Turn the power switch on (I), press **Stop**, and then press **Print Test**)

After you press **Print Test**, a sheet of paper feeds from the bottom paper tray, all of the characters on the printwheel print, and the paper ejects to the output tray.

When the print test finishes, the **Setup** light comes on. Press **Start**.

If the paper does not feed correctly, verify that the front exit sheet feed is attached correctly. (See 'Installation Of The IBM Front Exit Sheet Feed' page 105.) If paper still fails to feed correctly, refer to the Problem Determination Procedures.

You have completed loading the front exit sheet feed. Press **Start**. The printer will begin to print when it receives a job.

CLEARING MISFEEDS FROM THE IBM FRONT EXIT SHEET FEED

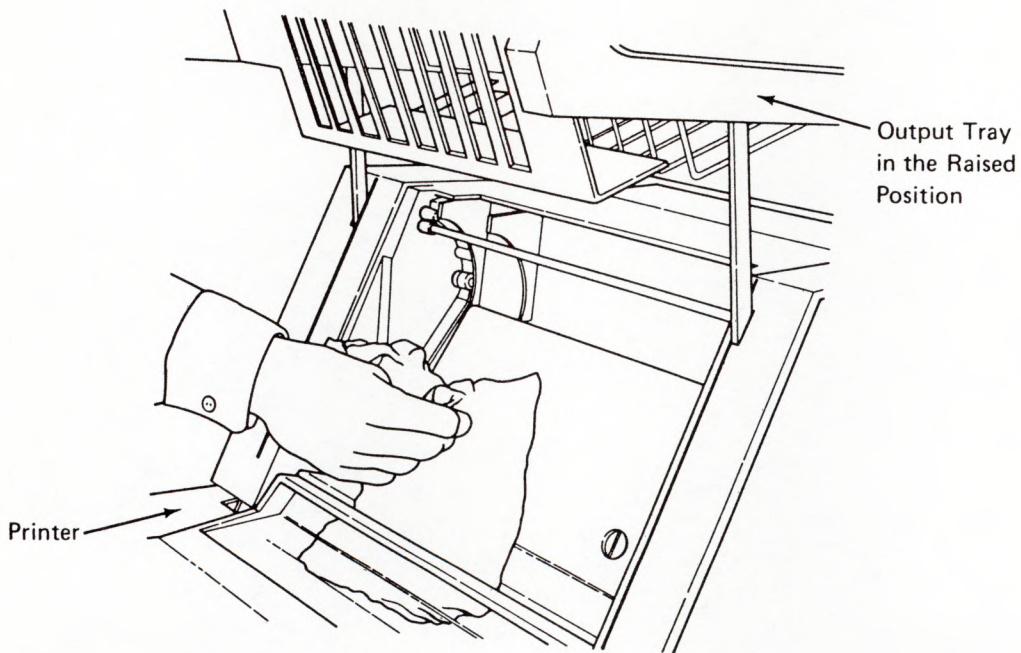
Note: Supplies and environment play an important role in proper machine operation. Work with your paper supplier to select acceptable paper for your application. All paper should be new, unused, and without packaging damage.

Supplies should be stored in the same environment as the machine. If you cannot do so, store a sufficient supply of paper and envelopes in the operating environment for at least 24 hours prior to use. Proper paper and envelope selection and storage will help the machine perform at its optimum level. (See Appendix G.)

Excessive curl or waviness in the paper may cause paper jams. Turning the paper over or around may help the paper feed better.

Output Path

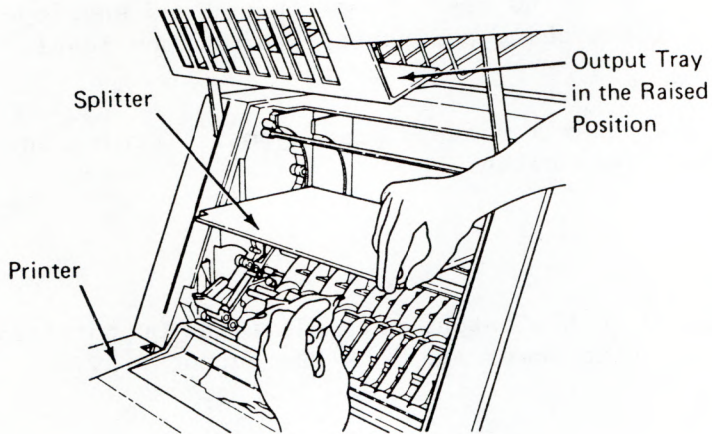
If the paper or envelope is jammed in the output path, lift the output tray, remove the paper or envelope, and then lower and lock the output tray.



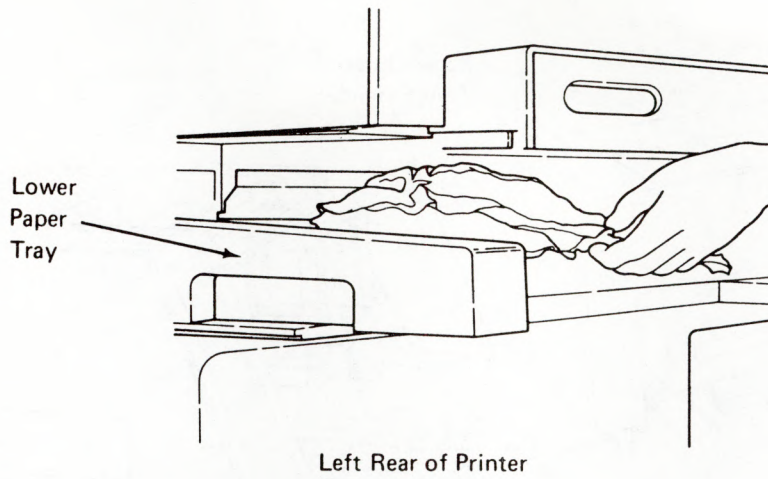

If paper is jammed in the input paper path do the following:

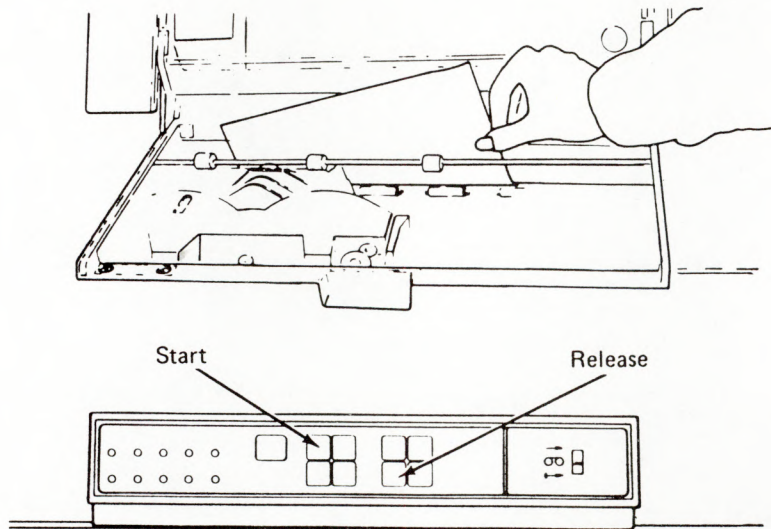

Turn the printer Off (O). Press the spring-loaded thumb latch or unplug the sheet feed cable from the rear of the printer.

It is recommended that two people remove the front exit sheet feed. Facing each other on opposite sides of the sheet feed, use the hand scoops and the metal support rod behind the envelope output to tilt the sheet feed forward; then lift the sheet feed straight up and away from the printer. Store the front exit sheet feed in a safe place.

Warning: Do not lift by the paper tray handles or the output tray. You may damage the trays.

Printwheels that are not encased in a cartridge are not compatible with the IBM 5218/IBM 5228 Printwheel Printer. Printwheel cartridges equivalent to the IBM 5218/IBM 5228 Printwheel Printer cartridges may also be used.

RIBBONS

The IBM 5218/IBM 5228 Printwheel Printer uses a long-life IBM TECH III cartridge ribbon (part number 1299463), or equivalent, with an average yield of one million characters.

CABLES

Connecting-cables for the IBM 5218/IBM 5228 Printwheel Printer are available in lengths of 3, 6, 30, and 60 meters (9.9, 19.7, 98, and 197 feet). Equivalent cables may also be used.

EXTRA PAPER TRAYS

Additional top or bottom paper trays can be ordered to accommodate the use of different types of paper. Contact your IBM Representative for more information. The top and bottom paper trays are not interchangeable.

PAPER STAND

Paper Stand (part number 1494596) is recommended for use with the IBM Tractor Feed and continuous forms. The paper stand will hold and stack continuous forms after printing.

PAPER SUPPORT TABLE

The Paper Support Table simplifies manual paper loading. It is recommended for use when cut sheet paper is being used and no other paper handling devices are attached.

ADAPTER CABLES

An adapter cable is required to connect the IBM Front Exit Sheet Feed to the IBM 5218 Printer model A01 or A02.

An adapter cable is required to connect the IBM Sheet Feed Paper Handler to the IBM 5218 Printer model A03 or A04.

Proper paper selection and environmental conditions will help provide you with optimum machine performance.

SHEET-FEED PAPER WEIGHTS

The following range of paper weights can be used in the sheet-feed devices:

- 60 to 90 g/m² (16 to 24 pounds)

Note: For optimum results, 75 g/m² (20 pound), 25% to 50% cotton content, plain bond paper is recommended.

The following paper sizes can be fed:

SHEET-FEED PAPER LIMITATIONS

The following paper supplies cannot be used reliably in the sheet-feed devices and may cause paper jams:

- Coated paper
- Vellums
- Highly sized erasable bond paper
- Synthetic paper
- Transluents
- Multi-sheet forms (bound or unbound)
- Peel-off pressure-sensitive labels
- Some chemically treated paper (for example, paper used to make copies without carbon paper)
- Pre-printed forms that require a high degree of registration for character location
- Envelopes
- Card Stock
- Some pre-printed papers where the printing process results in either introducing chemicals which contaminate the feed mechanism components or change the paper frictional characteristics
- Paper with edges bonded together
- Dark colored paper.

SHEET-FEED PAPER CONDITIONS

Paper in unsatisfactory condition will not feed reliably and may cause paper jams. The following can affect the use of the sheet-feed devices:

- Mixtures of paper sizes, types, or composition in the paper trays
- Paper embossed (raised lettering) over 0.5 mm (.020 in.)
- Poorly cut edges
- Curl in excess of 3.0 mm (0.118 in.)
- Rough or gummed surfaces
- Paper excessively damp or dry
- Dark colored paper
- Paper containing holes, perforations, cutouts or windows
- Folded paper
- Multi-part paper
- Paper with edges bonded together.

PAPER STORAGE

Paper should be stored flat in the original package, and it should be removed from the paper trays at the end of the day.

For optimum operation, paper should be preconditioned not less than 24 hours (preferably in an open box) in the same room as the printer.

FRONT EXIT SHEET FEED RECOMMENDED ENVELOPE WEIGHTS

The following range of envelope weights can be used in the Front Exit Sheet Feed.

- 60-90 gm/m² (16-24 lb.) bond

Note: For optimum results, 75 gm/m² (20 lb.) of sulfite or 25% cotton content plain bond is recommended.

Envelopes ranges are:

98.4 mm to 114.3 mm (3.875 in. to 4.5 in.) in width
190.5 mm to 241.3 mm (7.5 in. to 9.5 in.) in length

FRONT EXIT SHEET ENVELOPE LIMITATIONS

- Envelopes with windows, holes, perforations, cutouts, or deep embossing
- Envelopes with side flaps
- Envelopes with flaps that extend more than 60 mm (2.36 in.) beyond the fold line.

FRONT EXIT SHEET ENVELOPE CONDITIONS

- Envelopes that are stuck together
- Envelopes that will not stack flat
- Envelopes that are damaged or bent so that they are interlocked.

ENVELOPE STORAGE

Envelopes should be stored in their original box, and the box should be stored on its end so that the envelopes lay flat. This minimizes envelope curl. At the end of the day envelopes should be removed from the front exit sheet feed and stored in their original box.

For optimum operation, envelopes should be preconditioned not less than 24 hours (preferably in an open box) in the same room as the printer.

Paper meeting the following specifications is acceptable for use in the IBM 5218/IBM 5228 Printwheel Printer. Use of supplies outside of these specifications may result in unsatisfactory printing or feeding.

Total Maximum Thickness Including Carbons: 0.63 mm (0.025 inches)

Other Applications

When inserting envelopes, self-adhesive labels, cards, etc., the appropriate width, thickness, and weight requirements for single sheet or multiple sheet forms apply. Envelopes with gummed flaps are permitted. Do not use envelopes with metal or string parts.

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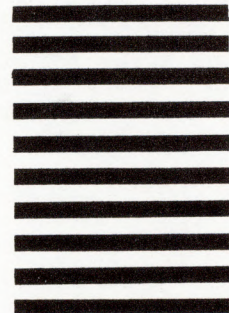


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
